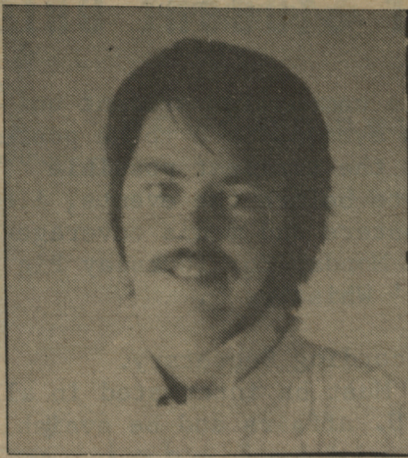
These positions were filled by acclamation. Since no one ran against the candidates there will be no election.

Student Union Election Procedures

If you are one of the many who don't exactly understand the election procedures of the upcoming election, this is what is happening.

VOTER ELIGIBILITY

1. Any student who is an active member of the Student Union is eligible to vote.

THIS MEANS if you paid your \$ 40 S.U. fee, you are eligible to vote.

2. You may vote for those persons who are running in your constituency.

This means that you can vote for all positions which represent the entire student body - Senate, Board of Governors, and Executive positions, and you may vote for those candidates who are running to represent a portion of the student body, but only if you are a member of that portion.

In the case of this week's election, then, all students may vote for their choice for Senate but only Education students may vote for the representative of that faculty.
