Gunfire In Prison

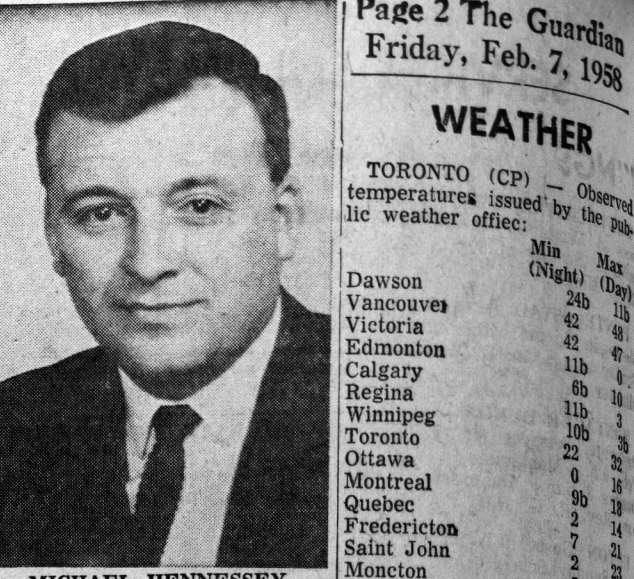
