SYDNEY (CP) — Tyrone Gardiner, 135, of Sydney River, N. S., Maritime lightweight champion, scored an impressive third round technical knockout over Bobby Speight of Saint John, N.B., in a scheduled eight-round non-title bout here Wednesday night.

The bout was stopped at 2:13 of the third round after Gardiner dropped the New Brunswick champion to the canvas on two occasions.

Gardiner sent Speight down with a stinging left hook to the jaw early in the round and then repeated the knockdown seconds later. Speight managed to stave off Gardiner until the 2:13 mark when he was battered to the floor with a stiff combination. Referee Pordena Smith quickly stepped in and called the fight.

In the six-round semi-final event Wayne Fields, 173, Annapolis, N.S., and Al Jackson, 176, Truro, battled to a draw. Francis "Rocky" McDougall, 126, Sydney, gained a four-round unanimous decision over Harold Sparks, 129, Halifax, while Stanley O'Dell, 134, Halifax, gained a unanimous decision over Sydney's Clayton Ryan, 129, in another four-round.

Nickel Company Earnings High

TORONTO (CP) — Financial results of all operations in the first quarter of this year are likely to show the second highest quarterly earnings in the company's history, Henry S. Wingate, chairman of International Nickel Company of Canada Ltd., said Wednesday at Inco's annual meeting.

North American demand for nickel, Mr. Wingate said, is running well ahead of 1961's rate, but is offset by lower European demand, with the result that for all areas demand in the first quarter will not reach last year's record rate.

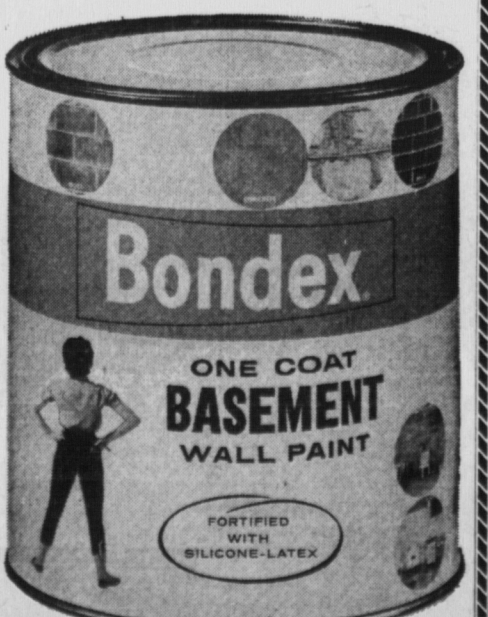
