JAMES BLANCHARD

In the sudden tragic passing of James Blanchard at the early age of twenty three years we have exemplified the words "In the midst of life we are in death." On Thursday, August 10th James accompanied by his brother Joseph left home and went to work in a nearby gravel pit. At about 3:30 P. M. a cave-in entangled Jim, crushing his leg and inflicting bodily injuries. Rev. J. C. Pile was summoned and administered the last rites of the Church while Dr. J. E. Fleming rendered first aid. His condition however was so serious that he was immediately rushed to the Charlottetown Hospital and shortly before 7 P. M. he succumbed to his wounds. When news of his death reached home it was a great shock to his relatives and friends.

The event has cast a shadow over the community and his many friends have sad hearts over his passing. Jimmie as he was familiarly known possessed a disposition that rendered his company pleasant, congenial and acceptable to all who knew him. He will be missed by the community, but especially in the home where his genial smile and kind disposition endeared him to his parents, brothers and sisters. It is hard to realize that he is gone, everything happened so quickly, however we know that the brave and confident heart is the true solace and that Jim is far happier in the world he lives in. So we must not let our hearts be heavy and though we do not understand, God's will is always wisest and best.

The funeral which was held from the home of his parents on Saturday August 13th to St. Ann's Church, Hope River was largely attended. Many came from afar to express their heartfelt sympathy to his bereaved family while Jimmie's friends offered the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for the repose of his soul. A Requiem Mass was sung by his pastor, Rev. E. J. Dalton who also conducted the service at the grave.

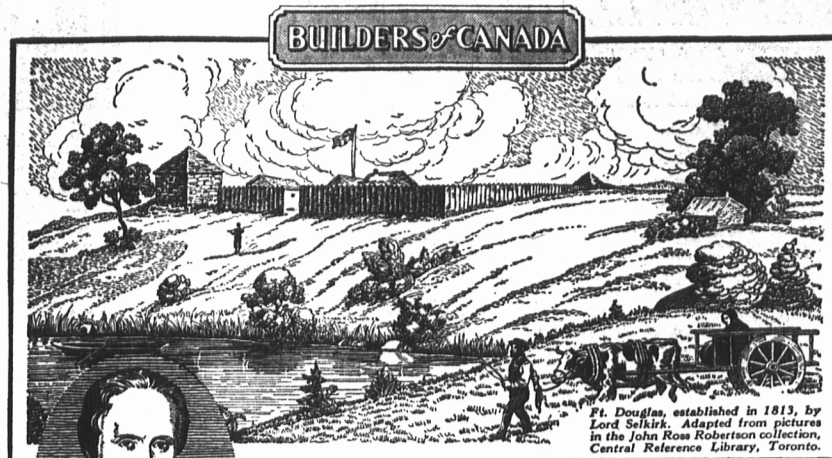

Currencies

MONTREAL, Aug. 20 —(CP)—Pound Sterling continued unchanged at .68 1-8 and the United States dollar held at par on Montreal foreign exchange Saturday. French francs remained steady at 2.64 15-16.

BOSTON, Aug. 20 —(AP)—Despite quiet foreign exchange market, the Dutch guilder today added .04 to his yesterday's gain of .06 of a cent in terms of the United States dollar. There was heavy continental selling of the Pound Sterling in London, but the price was held up through control operations.

The French franc lost a fraction to 2.64 15-16, while the spot price for the Pound Sterling at \$4.68 1-8 and the Canadian dollar at par remained unchanged.
