THE LISTENER.

N. R. Freeman, a justice of the peace at Winamac, Ind., who is 94 years old, has married 2,897 couples.

The late John M. Langston was the first negro to enter a theological school in the United States. He was born of slave parents.

Colonel J. J. Ayres, who died recently in Los Angeles, founded the first paper in the state in 1851. This was the Calaveras Chronicle.

It is said that Henry M. Stanley is going to resume his journalistic work. He is going out to Bulawayo as a guest of the chartered company.

Prince Krapotkine, the famous Russian anarchist, is a small, benevolent looking old gentleman, preaching brotherly love and deprecating violence.

Senor Joaquin Carcl, the new Spanish consul at Philadelphia, was a successful lawyer in Madrid until he entered the diplomatic service some years ago.

William Penn Nixon, who has just retired from control of the Chicago Inter Ocean, has been identified with that paper for over a quarter of a century. He was formerly a lawyer in Cincinnati.

Henry R. Pritchard of Indianapolis, who is the oldest living preacher in the Church of the Disciples of America, has preached 6,000 sermons. He has known General Harrison ever since the latter was a boy.

Thomas Arnold, father of Mrs. Humphry Ward, the novelist and social reformer, has lived for many years in Dublin, where he is a professor in the Catholic university and a fellow of the Royal university.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier, premier of Canada, is described as "tall, moderately slight, smooth shaven, with a graceful bearing and one not to be overlooked." He speaks with a strong French accent and is always courteous.

The Rev. Henry Schell, the pastor emeritus of Zion Lutheran church, Baltimore, who has just died at the age of 96 years, became pastor of Zion church 62 years ago and was universally known and loved in Baltimore.

Prince Louis Bonaparte is so popular in France that it is said the government is seriously concerned, but is afraid to banish him lest it incur the displeasure of the czar of Russia, who treats the prince as a member of his family.

Hugo Wolf, the Viennese composer, has developed such eccentricities that his friends have been obliged to put him in an asylum. A society formed in Vienna to spread his works made it its first rule that none of the members should have anything to do with Wolf personally.

General John T. Wilder, pension agent at Knoxville, Tenn., was born at Hunter, N. Y., in 1830. He was living in Indiana when the war broke out, and enlisted, serving with great gallantry through the war. At its close he went to Tennessee, and has probably done more than any man in the state for the mineral development of eastern Tennessee.

PEN, PENCIL AND BRUSH.

The French sculptor Falguiere has completed a gigantic statue of Liberty for the Pantheon in Paris. It is 33 feet in height.

Emile Zola delivered the oration at the recent unveiling of the memorial to the late Guy de Maupassant in the Parc de Monceau, Paris.

William Dean Howells, who recently made a trip to Europe for the benefit of his health, is said to have overtaxed his energies severely lately by his hard work.

Alfred Ordway, the well known painter, who died not long ago in Boston, was the founder of the Boston Art club and the Paint and Clay club. He was 78 years old at the time of his death.

Although she refuses to permit the public to see her photograph, Miss Marie Correll does not object to an oil painting of herself being placed on exhibition. The painting is now to be seen in a London gallery. It hangs in solitary state in a dim religious light.

For his new book, entitled "Following the Equator," it is said that Mark Twain will receive \$40,000, the whole of which he will turn over to his creditors, to whom he owes about \$20,000 more. He has been invited by an English publishing house to write his autobiography, and is said to be considering the offer.

Monkeys That Wear Shawls.

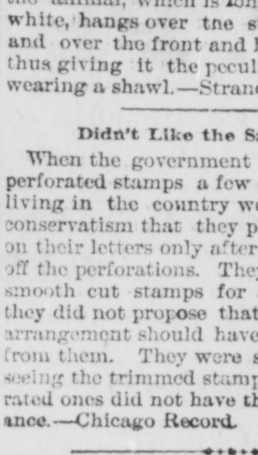
In certain districts in east Africa, especially in the forest of Kilimanjaro, there is a race of monkeys which have actually developed the wearing of shawls.

They do not steal these, however, and wear them through having seen men do this. On the contrary, these shawls are a provision of nature and are merely another exemplification of the law that animals develop certain peculiarities in accordance with their need to become less conspicuous in the forests or places in which they live.

These monkeys belong to a group of thumbless apes which are to be found only in Africa and are called by the natives guereza. They have a black tail, from which depends a beautiful white brush, while the whole of the hair of the back of the animal, which is long and silky and white, hangs over the sides of the body and over the front and hind legs as well, thus giving it the peculiar appearance of wearing a shawl.—Strand Magazine.

Didn't Like the Saw Edges.

False Teeth That Grow.

A Moscow dentist has solved the problem of supplying the human mouth with false teeth which will grow into the gums as firmly as natural ones. At the root of the false tooth holes are made. Holes are also made upward into the jaw. The tooth is then placed in the cavity. In a short time a soft granulated growth finds its way from the patient's jaw into the holes in the tooth. This growth gradually hardens and holds the tooth in position. It is stated that it does not matter whether the cavity in which the tooth is to be placed is one from which a natural tooth has been drawn recently or whether it has been healed for some years.—Moscow Letter.

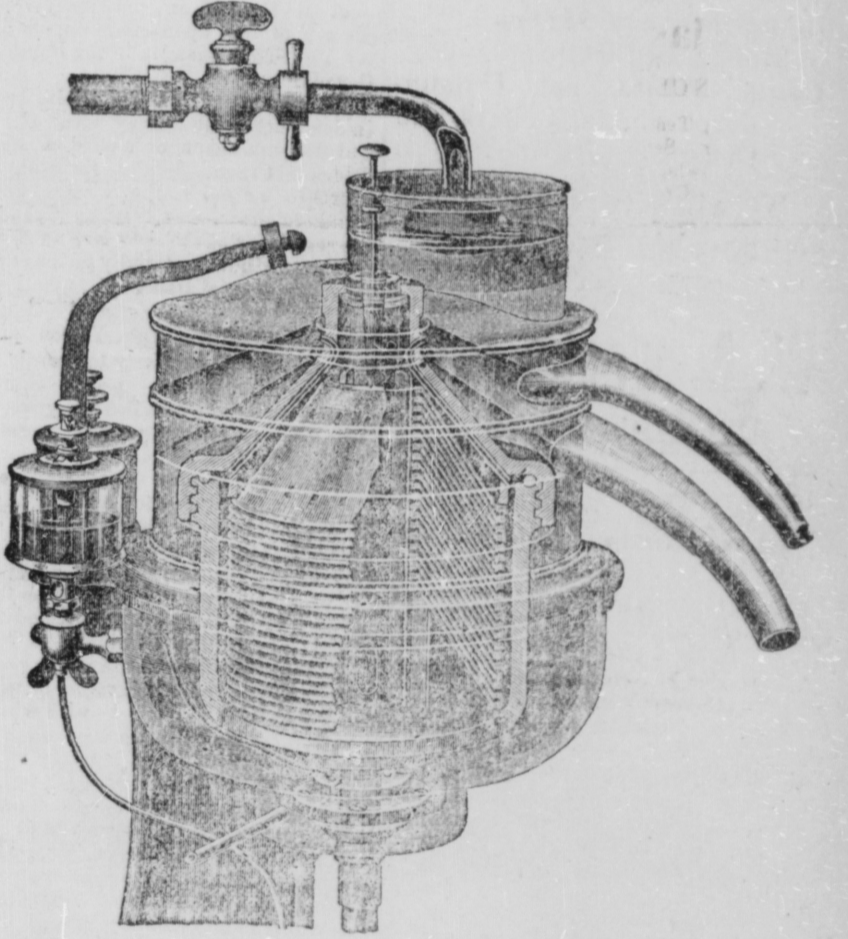
