## Great Debate Developing Over Conciliar Government

 VATICAN CITY (AP) — A great debate is developing in the Roman Catholic ecclesiastical council on the structure of the church's government. The exchange could expand this week but already sharp words have been used, unusual in such a conference.

Arguments in St. Peter's Basilica about the holy office focused on but one phase of a controversy involving the whole Vatican curia, the central administration assisting the Pope.

Reformers are demanding a shakeup of historic proportions. Pope Paul VI himself has called for a change.

Conservatives of the curia, a 1,000-man staff of predominantly Italian, are resisting. They clearly are not prepared for the basic alterations some progressive leaders are seeking.

Debate among the cardinals, patriarchs, archbishops, bishops and other prelates has brought statements that would have been surprising a few years ago.

**CALLED UNFAIR**  
 One cardinal denounced the holy office, the centuries-old guardian of Roman Catholic doctrine, as unfair and a scandal. Another cardinal suggested a fellow prince of the curia was speaking out of ignorance. An archbishop claimed a council minority is trying to frustrate reforms.

### Western Allies To Resist Berlin Highway Harassment

BERLIN (AP)—The Western allies will resist further Soviet harassment of their military traffic on the Berlin autobahn in the near future, an informed source said here.

"The argument has not yet been settled," a Western official said. "Our plans are based on the expectation of more trouble in the near future. The Russians don't give up that easily."

"We have made our point and our convoys have gone through, but there's no indication the Soviets are prepared to accept that situation."

More convoys are expected to roll along the 110-mile lifeline to the West in the coming week. Any day a convoy move can bring trouble, if the Soviets feel inclined to be bally.

In accordance with normal military procedure, the Western Allies do not announce troop moves in advance. They do give the Soviets four hours notice if a big convoy is scheduled, so the appropriate officers can be on hand to process them.

The quarrel comes down to the Soviet claim to call all the shots on the autobahn. The United States, Britain and France insist that they have the right to move it as they like. The Russians say that they have to count the soldiers moving over the road. The Western allies agree but they decide what facilities are made for counting them.

The Soviets complain they can't see to count men inside a dark truck. They demand that the truck tailgates be lowered. The Allies refuse to do so.

On one occasion, an American offered a Soviet officer a box to stand on if he turned it down.

On Oct. 29 the United States, Britain and France notified the Soviets of some rules they had agreed on. The men would get down and be counted if there were more than 30—not including drivers and co-drivers. They wouldn't get down if it was raining. They would drop tallies if the Soviet officer was more than six feet high.

## Canadian Promises Support To Commonwealth Countries

 KUALA LUMPUR, Malaysia—A member of the Newfoundland legislature said here that Canada will go to the aid of any Commonwealth country threatened by any power.

C. A. Sheppard of St. John's, speaking at the final session of the ninth annual Commonwealth parliamentary conference, told more than 100 delegates "Canada has a role to play in this world—that is to keep the peace."

He said thousands of Canadians lost their lives defending democracy during the Second World War.

"Canadians died around the world to defend freedom," Sheppard said. "We shall do so again." The Liberal member for the mid-west Ontario riding of Cambridge said.

"Canada lies in the shadow of the big powers—Russia to the north and the United States to the south. In case of an atomic war, we in Canada cannot escape the terrible consequences."

"A near miss on Detroit, the American industrial centre, would devastate a big part of Canada. Similarly, a near miss on Montreal would create havoc to a large part of the United States."

**CONNECTED WITH U.S.**  
 "Realizing this, we in Canada have tied our defence efforts to those of the United States."

He said Canada's alliance with the U.S. did not increase the power, prestige and credit position. On the contrary, the U.S. has been the most stabilizing force in the world.

The nuclear might of the United States has prevented the Communist countries from precipitating a major war, he said.
