IN PURSUANCE of the Act of the General Assembly of this Island, made and passed in the Eleventh year of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, intitled "An Act for raising a Fund, by an Assessment on land, for erecting a Government House and other Public Buildings within this Island."—I do hereby Publicly notify the Owners or Proprietors of Lands within this Island, for which the annual Assessment charged thereon by the said Act, of Two Shillings lawful money of this Island, for every Hundred Acres contained in the several Townships thereof, and in the several Islands belonging thereto; and the sum of Two Shillings for every Town Lot, Pasture Lot, Common Lot, and Water Lot granted in the Town and Royalty of Charlotte-Town—and the sum of One Shilling and Four-pence for every Town Lot, Pasture Lot, Common Lot and Water Lot in the Towns and Royalties of Georgetown and Princetown, is payable—that unless the Assessment for the current year shall be paid into my hands, or into the hands of my Deputies, on or before the first day of Hilary Term next, which will be on the Seventh day of January, 1834, Proclamation will be made in open Court on the last day of the said Term, of all such Lands as shall then be in arrear for non-payment of the sums charged thereon, agreeably to the directions of the said Act, and of the Act intitled "An Act to explain and amend an Act made and passed in the Eleventh year of the late King, for raising a Fund " by an Assessment on Land."
