London, England, Feb. 25.

If it be true that the Boer women fight in the trenches along with the men, their conduct however brave and heroic, is not remarkable at all. The women of many barbarous and half-civilized peoples have fought alongside of their husbands. In all their raids upon the Roman empire the ancient German tribes who were exactly such peoples as the Boers of to-day, half-barbarous races of herdsmen and hunters, men and women of great physical strength and courage, accustomed to hardships and outdoor life, were accompanied by their wives, who generally guarded the camps, which they desperately defended in case of a defeat of their husbands. The black barbarous tribes of West Africa have their regiments of Amazons, as everyone knows. In fact, Africa has always been the land of Amazons, and the Boer women are only following the example of their black sisters. The phenomenon is one, therefore, denoting degeneration rather than advance, a lapse of the Dutch from civilization to barbarism. And the antagonism of half-barbarian to civilization is at the bottom of the South African War.—Montreal Witness.
