Freer Trade Promised If Liberals Win Power

OTTAWA (CP)—A Liberal government would try to associate Canada with free trade movements taking shape in Europe, national leader Lester B. Pearson said Monday.

Mr. Pearson said such a move, to lay the foundations for a great Atlantic area of freer trade, would be one of the first things initiated should he lead his party back to power.

He spoke before the National Liberal Federation's advisory council, in a panel discussion at which party MPs were subjected

to wide-ranging questions from delegates.

Mr. Pearson said Liberal trade policy is to remove, to the maximum extent, barriers to international commerce including trade with the United States.

However, Canada should not only get into the U.S. market to a greater extent but should try to convert the whole Atlantic community into the freest possible trading area.

OTHER VIEWS

During the free-wheeling discussion, the meeting also heard these statements from key liberals:

Immigration: J. W. Pickersgill, former immigration minister, said that under the Conservatives this is "the most muddled mess in a series of messes." There was "inhumanity and brutality" in the way Immigration Minister Fairclough administered regulations.

Tight money: Financial critic William Benidickson, MP for Kenora-Rainy River, said the government has mismanaged financial matters and Prime Minister Diefenbaker has given an "alarming" hint that it wants to interfere with commercial banks' lending policy.

Foreign policy: Canada has suffered loss of prestige at the United Nations in the last two years and has lost the initiative in a number of issues, said Paul Martin, former health minister.

Small business: Mr. Pearson said Liberal policy is to encourage it. The party must fight any measure that would encourage monopoly by weakening the Combines Act, though not to the extent of "persecuting" big business as was being done now in one or two cases.

WIDEN INSURANCE

Social security: Mr. Martin said the Liberals will undertake such measures as sickness insurance and portable pensions as are within a government's financial resources and legislative ability.

Broadcast policy: Mr. Pickersgill said the present setup is not working well. It was Conservative policy to subordinate the publicly-owned CBC to the government, if only in a negative way through making it dependent on annual grants.

Capital punishment: If legislation were proposed to outlaw the death penalty, Mr. Pearson said, he would favor a free vote in the Commons, without party restraints.

Farm policy: Mr. Pearson said the government has messed up agriculture. The situation could not be met by temporary hand-outs. He had no objection to either deficiency payments or support prices in principle; it was the application that was important.
