

"THE TALL TEXAN"
AT CAPITOL 'SIDE
—A powerful story of man's lust for gold is unfolded in "The Tall Texan," Lippert Pictures Presentation now at the Capitol Theatre, Summerside, with leading roles expertly enacted by Lloyd Bridges, Lee J. Cobb, Marie Windsor and Luther Adler.

Strong characterizations are blended with thrilling action in this dramatic story of a party of five men and a woman seeking gold in the Southwest desert. Besides the emotional conflicts among the members of the unusual group, the antagonism of an Indian tribe explodes into battle when the lust for gold impels the party to invade sacred tribal grounds. Central figure is effectively portrayed by Bridges, as an escaped convict being returned to prison until the discovery of a rich lode diverts his custodian to join the gold rush. Cobb, always an interesting performer, offers one of his choicest character studies as a ship's captain who has been beached in disgrace. Miss Windsor is both attractive and capable as a woman torn between greed and her love for the young convict, while Adler gives a fascinating performance as a trader who overcomes his cowardice to seek the precious dust in forbidden territory.
