**Nine Killed In W. Virginia Mine**

SUMMERSVILLE, W.Va. (AP) Nine miners were killed and four others were missing and presumed dead Tuesday night after an explosion deep within a southeastern West Virginia coal mine. Seventeen men were trapped by the forenoon blast and it was four hours before the first of four survivors got out. Three others were carried out, two of them critically burned. But it was nine hours before the bodies of nine more were found.

State Mines Director Crawford L. Wilson said the remaining four were presumed dead.

Four bodies were brought out in a group, and about 8 p.m. five more reached the surface on the tenuous coal carrier belt.

Wilson said rescuers were continuing cautiously underground.

Unofficial word was that they had been unable to locate three of the missing men. The body of the fourth had been located but had not been brought out at 9 p.m. EST.

It was not determined immediately what caused the explosion.

**Joy Sweeps Birthplace Of New Roman Catholic Pope**

SOTTO IL MONTE, Italy (AP) Joy and cheers—and a good deal of confusion—swept this North Italian hamlet Tuesday night when the news arrived that a native son had been elected pope.

Angelo Giuseppe Cardinal Roncalli, now Pope John XXIII, was born in Sotto il Monte Nov. 25, 1881. He had four brothers and five sisters. Five are dead but three brothers and a sister still live in this village in the shadow of the Alps.

Tuesday night the town of 1,773 came alive. Bonfires blazed everywhere—on the main square, in courtyards and side streets. Children danced and played around the flames.

**FIRES ON HILLS**  
Bonfires also burst out on the hills around the town and fireworks flashed through the sky. Hundreds of peasants from the surrounding countryside thronged into the village. Photographers and reporters raced in from Milan, 50 miles away. For a time there was a traffic jam in the main square.

Excitement and confusion reigned in a factory, where two of the Pope's brothers work, and at the homes of the brothers and sisters.

The brothers are Zaverio, 75, Alfredo, 69, and Giuseppe, 64. The sister is Assunta, 73.

Also living here are 40 nieces, nephews, grandnieces and grandnephews of the new pontiff.

Giuseppe, father of 10 and the youngest brother of the Pope, recalled:

**NOT RICH**  
"My father certainly was not a rich man and we did not always have plenty of food... but we were always healthy."

"My brother is as healthy as a man of his age can be. When he was young he walked two hours each day to the seminary and then two hours back home."

Giuseppe said he believed the new Pope picked the name of John "because our village church is dedicated to St. John."

The father of the family died in 1935. The mother, Maria Anna Mazzola, died in 1939.
