By KEN SMITH Canadian Press Business Editor TORONTO (CP)—Two transplanted fishermen have developed a new lobster trap and now they're trying to beat the odds of the world's sea.

First War leader Sir Sam Still Controversial Figure

By BEN WARD OTTAWA (CP)—It was the morning of Aug. 3, 1914, and Sir Sam Hughes, minister of militia in the Borden government, was in his office blaring with anger on the desk lay the latest dispatches about the European war.

Before his forced resignation in 1918 he became perhaps the most prominent national figure of the war, certainly the most talked-about. He was knighted by the king, pushed himself to the rank of honorary lieutenant-general and won a large measure of public acclaim. After the war he reaped almost universal criticism.

Sir Sam, as he is best remembered, was born in 1853 of Scottish-Irish - Huguenot ancestry on a farm in Durham County which borders Lake Ontario east of Toronto. His maternal great-grandfather was one of Napoleon's generals at Waterloo; his father's family settled in Wellington.

As a boy he served during the Fenian Raids of 1870 as a private in the 58th Victoria Infantry Battalion and rose in that militia unit to become commanding officer.

By 1897 he was in the Empire, Canada was automatically in the fight and Sam Hughes settled down to it with zest.

FELT CHEATED OF VC Fifty-year-old Sir Sam, a strange man who led Canada's military effort in the opening two years of the war, was charged out of one not but two Victoria Crosses.

RIGHT WEEKLY For a time he taught school and by the age of 32 had saved enough to buy The Wanderer, a weekly newspaper in Lindsay, Ont. Six years later he ran as Conservative candidate for the federal seat of North Victoria, lost, then won a byelection the following year.

When Robert Borden's Conservatives won the 1911 election he was named minister of militia under Sir Wilfrid Laurier. Sam Hughes was named minister of militia in 1912, responding to today's defence portfolio.

His memoirs written in 1928 Sir Robert confessed that he had misgivings about the appointment but gave in to pressure.
