LONDON, (Reuters)—Leftist Anvarin Bevan's forces will make a determined bid to smash the trade unionists' grip on the Labor party at the annual party conference later this month.
This disclosure came Wednesday night in publication of the conference agenda, containing a series of proposals for slashing the powers of the moderate labor unions and increasing those of the local political organizations.

19 U. S. Soldiers, 2 Crew-Members Die In Crash

MCHORD FIELD, Wash. (AP)—Burned wreckage of a chartered airliner that crashed with 19 soldiers and two crew members Tuesday night was found Wednesday on a timbered western Washington mountainside.
There were no survivors. Fifteen bodies were found in the first check at the scene.
The Regina Airlines DC-3 was on a flight to McChord with enlisted men from Fort Ord, Calif. The soldiers were believed to have been flying north for assignment overseas.
A wide search was launched after the plane's last radio report over Portland, Ore., Tuesday night.
The crash scene was about 100 miles north of Portland and about 40 miles from the plane's destination.
The crash was at about the 2,000-foot level in second-growth timber. The 15 bodies found immediately were reported burned.
