NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market declined Thursday for the second consecutive session, but it did so in a moderate way. There was, however, considerable resistance to the fall throughout the day.
 In motors and steel Chrysler was up 1-4 and Republic Steel up 2. Oils were down, with the exception of the volatile Amerasia Petroleum which shot ahead 12 1/2 points at 216 1/2. Distillers were higher with Schenley up 1 1/4 and Hiram Walker up 1.
 The Associated Press average of 60 stocks dropped back 1.10 at \$149.50.
 Volume amounted to 3,300,000 shares.
 Allegheny Corp., which controls New York Central, was at the top of the most active list off 1-8 at 7 3/4 on 82,900 shares, and it was followed by the railroad itself off 1-2 at 29.
 Stocks losing ground were General Motors, United Aircraft, Radio Corp., American Telephone, Consolidated Natural Gas, Western Union, Union Carbide, Du Pont, Westinghouse Electric, Atlantic Coast Line, Santa Fe, Baltimore and Ohio, Standard Oil, Royal Dutch Petroleum, Cities Service, Pan American World Airways, Johns-Manville, Georgia Pacific Plywood and Douglas Aircraft.
