Ottawa's Mayor. OTTAWA, Jan. 5.—Bakette, a prominent Conservative worker, was elected Mayor to-day by a plurality of nearly a thousand.

The Late Father Labelle. ST. JEROME, Jan. 5.—The remains of the late Mgr. Labelle arrived here by special train to-day. The great politician and priest will be buried on Thursday next.

The Cattle Trade. MONTREAL, Jan. 5.—Enquiry into the Canadian live stock cattle trade to the Old Country was opened to-day under the direction of W. H. Smith, Deputy Minister of Marine.

A Montreal Failure. MONTREAL, Jan. 5.—J. A. Patterson & Co., wholesale milliners, assigned to-day with liabilities about \$200,000. The Bank of Montreal is a creditor to the extent of \$100,000, the rest being due in English houses.

Will Pay 100 Cents. NEW YORK, Jan. 5.—It is announced to-day that Decker, Howell & Co., who assigned about two months ago would resume business at once and that the assignee would pay 100 cents on the dollar on all just claims presented.

Toronto's Mayor. TORONTO, Jan. 4.—The civic election took place to-day, and was keenly contested. Mayor Clarke's opponent, Ald. McDonald, developed some strength, but his Worship was re-elected by over 1,100 majority.

Behring Sea. OTTAWA, Jan. 5.—The alleged despatch from here to the New York Herald in reference to Behring Sea is a hoax. No information has been received here as to any reply from Blaine to Salisbury nor as to what Witsen intends doing towards the protection of Canadian sealers.

Boston Failures. BOSTON, Jan. 5.—Lowell Bros. & Co., pur due dealers, Fannie's Hall Market, have assigned, liabilities and assets are not stated. Nathan Schloss, tobacconist, Hanover Street, has also assigned, liabilities \$40,000. Alonzo Coy & Bro., restaurateurs, Atlantic Avenue, are commencing with their creditors at 25 cents, liabilities \$35,000. Drake & Brinn's manufacturers and dealers in trunks and bags have gone into insolvency.

Nova Scotia's Troubles. HALIFAX, Dec. 4.—Moir Son & Co., have trouble with their soft bread bakers' the market asked for increases in pay and were refused that similar members of the firm discharging them. The men claim that this course is owing to the fact that they belong to union.
