CONTRACT BRIDGE

You are South, both sides vulnerable. The bidding has been:

North	East	South	West
1♥	Pass	1♠	Pass
3♣	Pass	?	?

What would you now bid with each of the following four hands?

- ♠A J 8 6 ♣Q 5 ♦A J 9 ♣Q 6 4 3
- ♠Q 8 6 4 3 ♣9 5 ♦J 8 ♣K J 7 2
- ♠A K J 5 4 3 ♣Q 8 6 3 ♦9 4 ♣7
- ♠K Q J 9 8 4 2 ♣A ♦K 7 ♣8 6 5

1. Three notrump. With a sound opening bid facing an opening bid, it is clear a game contract must be reached. With balanced distribution and all-around strength, the indications point strongly to a notrump game. If partner's distribution happens to be such that he prefers a suit contract, our hand is sufficiently flexible to support such an effort.

The important thing is to avoid bidding only two notrump or raising to three clubs, either of which permits North to pass with a minimum opening bid. Both bids would merely invite North to continue the bidding. Such invitations are reserved only for hands where there is genuine doubt whether a game should be reached. In this case no such doubt should exist.

2. Pass. At the other end of the pole are those hands where previous bidding indicates game is very unlikely. The two club bid by North is of ambiguous character. It may be based on minimum values of may also be made with a moderately good hand. Our hand is not going to get excited about nothing a club fit has been found.

There is a limit to how strong North's hand can be. His failure to jump to two notrump wipes out, for practical purposes, any chance of a notrump game. The other possibility for game, five clubs, is too remote, with our relatively poor hand, to be seriously considered. A raise to three clubs might easily result in getting the partnership too high.

3. Three hearts. The skip bid forces North to continue to game. We should be perfectly willing to play this hand for game at hearts. It is not necessary to rebid the excellent spade suit, since a heart contract is surely playable whether partner has spade support or not. Rebidding spades can only confuse the issue.

4. Four spades. Lacking a satisfactory fit for either of North's suits, and holding a powerful suit that requires little or no support from partner, both message, can be delivered in one motion by leaping to four spades.

The alternate bid of three spades, though forcing to game, would show a slightly weaker hand and less solidity in the spade suit itself. The four spade bid is mildly invitational toward a slam a contract we should not fear if

Israeli Woman Soldier Says Femininity Not Lost In Khaki

MONTREAL (CP) — Donning khaki doesn't mean shedding daintiness, Israel's top-ranked woman soldier said Wednesday.

Col. Shoshana Gershon, speaking at a press conference here, said femininity is not lost when a girl gets drafted into the Israeli army.

"We don't train our girls to be actual fighting soldiers," she said. "We don't want them to ever meet an enemy face to face for we hold the idea firm that a woman killed is a future mother killed."

"What we do teach them is the ability to defend themselves, to handle rifles, sten guns and hand grenades."

"They serve usually as auxiliary helpers to the army proper, as guards, signal operators, and as drivers."

Every Israeli girl enters the army at 18 for two years of compulsory service. But she doesn't get toughened.

Even the army's nickname is feminine.

"Chen, shortened from 'chell-noshim', is our army's common name," Col. Gershon said. "And 'chen' is Hebrew for charm."

The two years of army life does a lot to assimilate new girls into the Israeli way of life, she said.

"She learns the art of house-keeping, of washing and ironing, of child care. And more than that she learns the elementary facets of good citizenship."

"... She receives training that fits her to cope better with her own life and problems when she emerges from the army."

"We frequently hear mothers say how a few months in the army have made their daughters neater, more skilful, and more self-reliant."

The women's army was established 10 years ago when the state of Israel was proclaimed, but Col. Gershon herself has a military background going back 30 years to when she joined Haganah, the defence army of the Jewish community in Palestine.

She led a unit of British army women drivers in Egypt during the Second World War and served two years in Italy as a member of the Jewish Brigade. She is in Montreal in connection with an Israeli bond drive.


