CONTRACT BRIDGE

The bidding:
East 1♠ South West North
Pass 1♣ Pass 1♦

Opening lead—eight of spades.
South's club bid is of the minimum variety. Once a minimum opening bid is made, an obligation arises to identify it subsequently at a minimum. South exaggerated his high card strength when he voluntarily rebid over East's spade overall. He had been relieved of the duty to rebid by the intervening call. The one notrump bid advised North there were added values above an opening bid. A pass would have been more correct.

Although North's two notrump bid is debatable, South's three notrump is not. He had already announced an opening bid, followed with a statement that he had extra values above it, and then continued with a further bid which amounted to saying he had still more than his first two bids showed.

He suffered a just fate during the play. He won the queen of spades with the ace. West took the diamond return, played a spade, East winning and returning another spade. After South cashed the diamonds, he ran out of tricks, the defense collecting four spade tricks and three aces for a three trick penalty.

South might have made the hand, peculiarly enough, if he had played the nine of spades on the opening lead. If East returns a spade, the jack wins, and the diamond ace is forced out. West, out of spades, cannot prevent declarer from getting nine tricks. South loses only a spade and three aces.

Declarer should know that East cannot have a spade suit plus two side aces because East dealt and passed. Therefore, the spade queen should be ducked to hamper the defenders' communications.

However, a shrewd East can counter South's strategy. He will realize the futility of continuing spades and that a shift is called for. The choice will lie between clubs and hearts. In the light of South's club bid, a low heart is more promising. Declarer wins and leads a diamond. When West takes the ace, he returns a heart and East plays the ace and another heart. West's fourth heart eventually becomes the setting trick.

Ottawa Seeking To Market Canadian Coal In Japan

OTTAWA (CP) — Negotiations currently going on with the aim of selling Canadian coal to Japan may eventually bring new life to coal mines in Alberta and British Columbia.

"There is nothing definite about it at the moment," Miles Prudham told a reporter in an interview. "But we're exploring the possibility."

He and W. E. Uren, chairman of the Dominion Coal Board, discussed possible sale of Canadian coal to Japan with Homan Kawano, deputy Japanese trade minister, during Mr. Kawano's visit here earlier this week.

Mr. Prudham said coal board officials are following up the talks by checking with western mine operators on the possibility of supplying the types of coal Japan would like. At the moment, Japan buys most of its coal from the United States.

Canada has tried to sell its coal to Japan in the past, but without success. Mr. Prudham indicated there is more hope it will be possible this time.

He said the possibility will certainly be a topic under consideration at the Sept. 10 conference of himself and provincial mines ministers.

"We don't see why we couldn't find a profitable market in Japan for Alberta and B.C. coal," he added.

The Japanese were interested in obtaining both coking and steam coal. The Crownpoint Pass area of Alberta had plenty of coking coal west of Calgary and Edmonton and between the two provinces steam coal supplies were almost unlimited.

If the deal went through it likely would have to be for a substantial amount of coal and extend over a long period to justify improvements that would have to be made in west coast coal handling facilities.

But the Japanese have made one thing clear. Mr. Prudham said — if they are to buy coal from Canada, along with wheat and other products, Canada must buy more goods from Japan so that Japan will have the necessary dollars to continue its trade with this country.
