Edinburgh Scotsman Observes Centenary

LONDON (CP) — One of Scotland's oldest and most respected newspapers, The Scotsman, owned by Canadian publisher Roy Thomson, Wednesday celebrated its 100th birthday as a daily.

Messages of congratulation from the Queen, Prime Minister Eden and Sir Winston Churchill arrived in the newspaper's Edinburgh office. The Queen offered her "sincere congratulations to all concerned in its production."

The Scotsman has an average circulation of about 55,550. It was purchased almost two years ago by Thomson, Toronto-born publisher and honorary president of The Canadian Press.
