

# Liberals Critical Quebec Is Not In Hospital Plan

OTTAWA (CP) — Liberal opposition members Friday fired criticisms at Health Minister Monteith because Quebec still has not joined the national hospital insurance plan.

During Commons discussion of health department estimates, Premier Duplessis also was blamed because his provincial government has not signified its intention to join the five provinces whose plans went into effect July 1. Three others are due to come in next Jan. 1.

J. P. Deschatelets (L — Montreal Maisonnette — Rosemount), among others, criticized Mr. Monteith on the ground that as late as Thursday the minister said he had not communicated with Mr. Duplessis on the possibilities of Quebec joining the national plan.

"Mr. Duplessis must be blamed for the negative stand he has taken on this issue," Mr. Deschatelets said. "The minister also must be placed in the same boat for his lack of initiative."

**QUEBEC DISTURBED**

Many in Quebec were disturbed by the fact that they will contribute, through taxes, to a national plan from which they will not benefit.

Dr. J. E. Bissonnette (PC — Quebec West) said Mr. Duplessis now is considering whether to join the federal plan. The premier had told him: "No man can open a grocery until he has some-

thing to put on the shelves." Dr. Bissonnette said this means Quebec needs more hospital beds before it can enter the plan. It now has started a big hospital construction program.

If Mr. Duplessis has refused to enter the plan, Mr. Deschatelets said, he must have a reason; but it was up to Mr. Monteith to find a formula "to suit the exigencies of Mr. Duplessis."

Mr. Deschatelets said that if Mr. Monteith is "too shy to discuss" the issue with Mr. Duplessis he should call on Prime Minister Diefenbaker "to pinch-hit for him." The prime minister and the Quebec premier were said to be on good terms.

**ESTIMATES COST**

Earlier, Mr. Monteith estimated cost to the federal treasury of the hospital insurance plan this year at \$70,000,000. The four western provinces and Newfoundland entered it July 1. Ontario, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia are scheduled to start Jan. 1.

Dr. Hugh M. Horner (PC — Jasper-Edson) suggested the creation of a medical advisory council.

In other Commons developments, Mr. Diefenbaker broke into routine proceedings with a special statement welcoming announcement of Anglo-American proposals to suspend nuclear tests for one year, provided Russia is ready to negotiate a permanent ban. He said he would

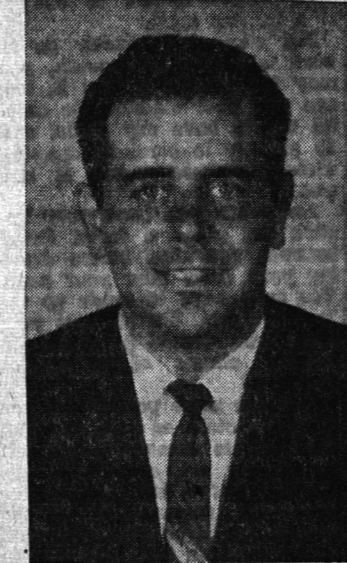

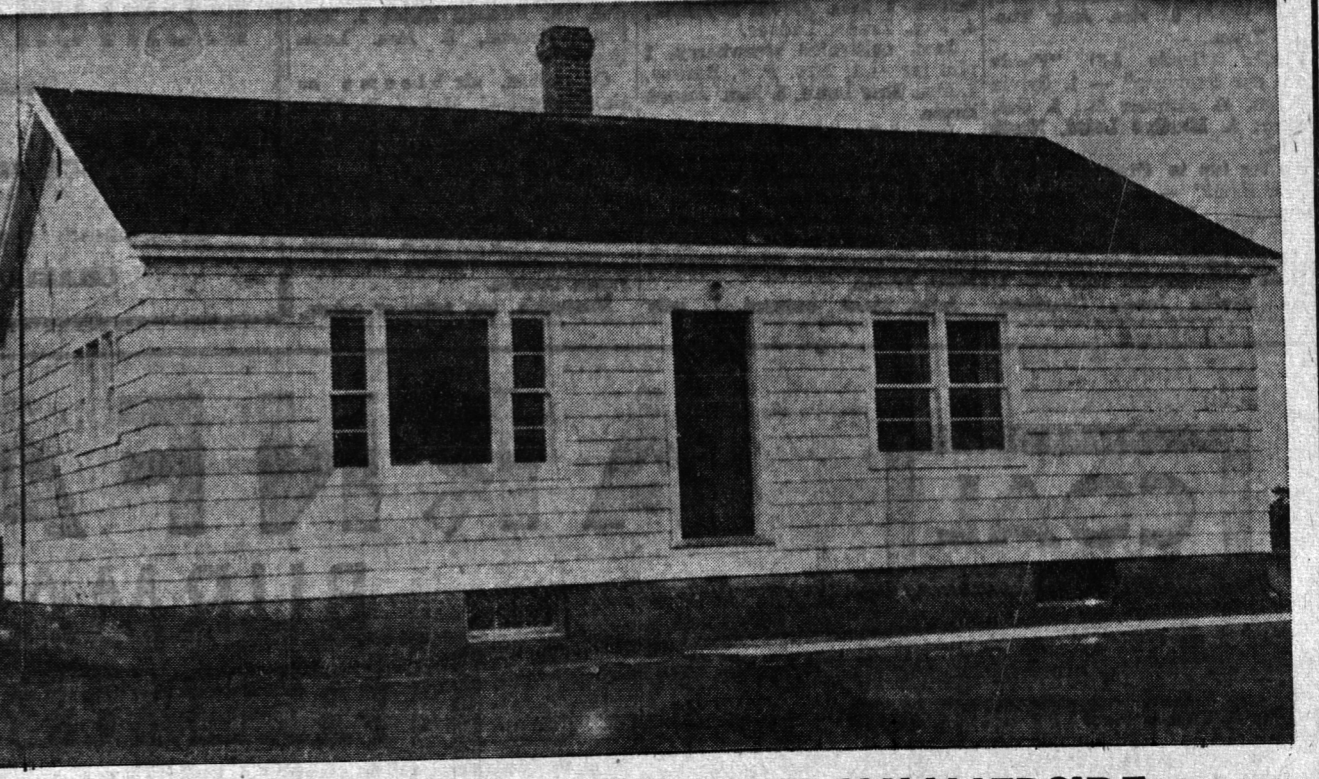
