### NOTES FROM THE GALLERY.

Sir,—I notice that the leader of the present government has introduced a bill to the House to amend the Liquor Regulation Act. In his speech supporting the measure he dwelt at length upon the evils of the liquor traffic and read a large number of extracts from newspapers in defence of his views. Let us try to be candid about liquor business and approach it in an honest and sincere manner. The facts then are the: The Scott Act has been found in this city at least to have been a dismal failure time and time again. And because the Scott Act failed this wise, this pure and patriotic legislature of ours whose first care it was and is to protect the youth from the vice of drink did what? Bring forward wise legislation minimizing and remedying the evil? Not at all. It passed an unrestricted license law—it gave the city the unparalleled gift of free rum. The condition of affairs under the law is that anybody complying with certain nominal conditions can sell as much as he likes. This is the broad unbounded and unrestricted license law given by the temperance legislature of this country to promote temperance principles in this province. The achievement is not worthy of comparison with Mrs. Partington's laudable efforts to push back the Atlantic Ocean with a broom, and yet this is the sum of temperance work in this city as represented by Act of Parliament. When the government and the temperance people found that the Scott Act was not effective what was obviously their duty if they wished to promote the welfare of the community? To pass a better law, and it is paying a very poor compliment to the Scott Act to say the present one is better. But if it is not then who are responsible? I say emphatically the government who passed it and the temperance people, clergymen and all else, who advocated it. Never in the history of the world was more insane and childish legislation passed. Never was legislation brought into effect better calculated to defeat its ostensible object. The duty of the legislature, if they wish to raise the moral tone of this city in the matter of temperance, is to restrict, and if so how? Not by free rum. Local prohibition would, I am very sure, be open to the same objections as the Scott Act. Let the Legislature ignore silly sentimentalism touching blood money and the common sense of the country will back them. The way to restrict is to restrict, and that by taxing, and because you tax you do not therefore redress. Taxation will limit the numbers engaged in the trade. We have now unlimited license, we have unmitigated evil, let us have a limited license mitigated evil. The measure before the House will lead to perjury and law-breaking, and will, I am sure, remedy matters a particle. For or five or ten thousand dollars might be raised to supplement our revenue which is not by any means plethoric, and if the term license be objectionable, employ one more euphemism but none the less expressive. But if the Premier should have no regard to using the tax he can easily dispose of it to his friend, Sir Wilfrid, who evidently is not troubled with any such inconvenient qualms. The fund so raised might go towards the construction of the Murray Harbor Railway. Seriously it is time this liquor business should be grappled with in a practical and statesmanlike manner. We have had enough and more than enough of this silly and harmful liquor legislation. Why not be consistent? What is done with the fines now collected? They are made from liquor sales. If a penalty for some criminal offence be the payment of a fine don't the government use the money for a diurnal legitimate purpose? Why not call this monstrosity a fine. Impose a fine then of \$200 per annum, say, upon every saloon-keeper and make regulations in regard to the hours of sale, etc., and have a careful system of liquor inspection, and by this means you reduce the number of liquor shops, make the goods better to drink and derive a revenue which on the basis of 40 saloons would amount to \$8,000 per year. This would be at once feasible and profitable and restorative.

France Gets Territory in Siam.

PARIS, May 2.—Siam, according to a despatch from Singapore, has ceded to France the province of Luang Prabang, in the northeastern part of the kingdom. France in return undertakes to evacuate the town of Chantaboon, about 175 miles southeast of Bangkok, and to withdraw from the so-called neutral zone.

### Another Lynching.

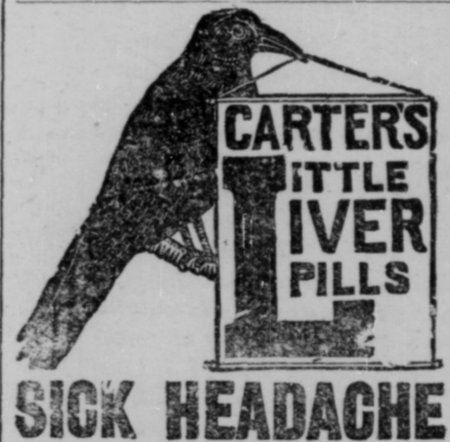
MEMPHIS, Tenn., May 2.—Information was received at Memphis last night that Willis Sees, a negro, aged 30 years, was taken from the jail at Osceola, Ark., Sunday morning at 1 o'clock and hanged in the jail yard by a mob of 40 men. Sees was in jail on a charge of barn burning. After being suspended in mid-air twice the negro confessed the crime of which he was charged and he was then hanged. Several houses have been burned in the neighborhood of Osceola recently and this is given as the reason for the mob taking the law into its jurisdiction.

—The \$20,000,000 which the United States agreed to pay for the Philippines was a few days ago, handed over to Spain's representative at Washington. The Montreal Gazette remarks that the sum is the first money Spain has made out of her colonies for many years.

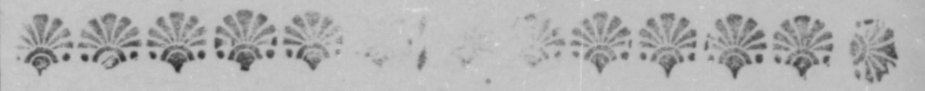
