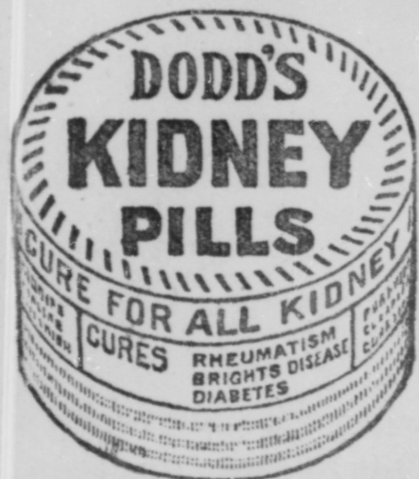

Housekeeping Accounts.

The habit of keeping a strict account of every farthing received and spent is one of the most effectual checks to unnecessary outlay. If it is to be of any service this account must be kept regularly and precisely. The entries, however trifling, should be made daily, and at the end of the week the sum total on either side should be added up and balanced, care being taken to notice whether the cash in hand agrees with the statement of account. At certain fixed dates, such as the end of each week or end of each month, the details of payment should be examined and each item carried out and placed under its respective head, such as meat, bread, milk, fruit, etc. By this means a comparison can be easily made between the expenses of one week and those of another, and excess or unnecessary expenditure can be at once discovered and checked. When the ready-money system is not adopted in the family, and bills are sent in for payment, a separate book should be kept in which an entry can be made of every article supplied for household use; and this book should be compared with the tradesmen's accounts when they are presented for payment, so that any discrepancy between the two may be pointed out and rectified.

Hints to Parents.

One of the greatest mistakes parents can make in dealing with their children is to threaten to tell the policeman if a child will not be good. Such threats should never be made, and it is only necessary to give the matter a thought for parents to see the harm that may be done. If a child should have the misfortune to get lost on the streets, one of the safest hands it may get into is that of a policeman. If such a child, however, has been led to dread even the name of such a being, imagine the terror the little one will feel if at such a time he even sees one of these "majesties of the law." Cases are known where a child has never recovered from the fright of being taken by a policeman to some place, say the station-house, to wait until its parents have been located.

Children cannot have too much fresh air, but so long as the weather is cold they should be given a run and a lift in the car and baby carriage alternately. The method of locomotion adopted by very young children is not very expeditious, and they are scarcely able to get thoroughly warm on their own account. Never let the little folks go out feeling cold. Let them start with the fullest supply of animal warmth which is then likely to remain with them whilst they are out. The morning walk should be preceded by a hot drink, such as half-a-cup of beef tea, cocoa, or milk, with bread, or bread and butter, as the case may be; and in the afternoon the children are thoroughly warm after the substantial midday meal. Headgear requires a little thought, as nursery children want hats that afford some protection to their ears, though it is not necessary that these should be covered up, except in the case of infants lying in their perambulators. Whilst sending youngsters out in nearly every sort of a clear day it is well to guard against the east wind which is as treacherous as it is malevolent.—Canadian Home Journal.

Hot Water.

Hot water has far more medical virtues than many believe or know. Because it is so easily procured, thousands think it valueless. The uses of hot water are, however, many. For example, there is nothing that so promptly cuts short congestion of the lungs, sore throat, or rheumatism as hot water when applied promptly and thoroughly. Headache almost always yields to the simultaneous application of hot water to the feet and back of the neck. A towel folded several times and dipped in hot water, and quickly rung out and applied over the painful part in

toothache or neuralgia will generally afford prompt relief. A strip of flannel or napkin folded lengthwise and dipped in hot water and rung out and applied round the neck of a child that has the croup will sometimes bring relief in ten minutes. Hot water taken freely half an hour before bedtime is helpful in the case of constipation, while it has a most soothing effect upon the stomach and bowels. A goblet of hot water taken just after rising, before breakfast, has cured thousands of indigestion, and no simple remedy is more widely recommended by physicians to dyspeptics. Very hot water will stop dangerous bleeding.—McCall's.

The Value of Mutton Suet.

One drop of warm mutton suet applied to any sore at night, just before retiring, will soon cause it to disappear; the same for chapped hands or parched lips. If people only knew the value of the healing properties of so simple a thing no house keeper would be without it. For cuts or bruises it is almost indispensable. Keep the wound clean, and put a little suet, melted, on a rag, and you will be astonished to see how soon the sore will heal.
