HONEYCOMB CELLS.

Drones have no stings and no means of defense.

The less swarming you have the more surplus honey you may expect.

After honey is extracted leave it in open vessels until evaporation ceases.

Any queen cell, after being sealed over, may be hatched out with artificial heat.

A weak colony will never build nice comb honey, no matter how good the honey flow.

Bees when building comb begin at the top and hang in heavy clusters to their combs as they complete them.

Any kind of ground that is not too marshy or wet will do to locate the hives upon. Facing the south or east is best.

As long as bees have abundant room to work in the broad chamber they will not go into any surplus boxes. When the brood chamber is full, put in boxes.

Choose a place to locate a colony of bees and let it remain. Do not shift it around from one place to another. Changing disturbs the bees.
