BIG SOAP FACTORY.—The City Council of Toronto has ratified an agreement under which the Sunlight Soap Company of England, will establish a big factory in that city.

COMBATTING TUBERCULOSIS.—The Medical Record says that a society for combating tuberculosis has been organized in Chicago. It is to be known as the Illinois Society for the Prevention of Tuberculosis, and its membership will include all physicians, health officers, veterinarians, and others interested in the extermination of tuberculosis.
