



### Three Accidents Are Investigated

**SOURIS** — The Souris detachment of the RCMP investigated three accidents over the weekend. Two of these occurred on the Souris Line Road.

In the first a 1960 model car driven by Leroy MacDonald, Chepstow, was demolished when the vehicle went off the shoulder of the road, hit a culvert and rolled over ending on its hood. The accident occurred about two miles from Souris at 3:45 p.m. Saturday. MacDonald was taken to Souris Hospital by Perry's Ambulance and treated for minor cuts and bruises.

The second accident on the Souris Line Road occurred on Sunday involving a 1960 half-ton truck driven by Sterling John McGillivray of Souris River. The accident occurred about three miles from Souris. The truck received approximately \$200 damage. There were no injuries.

The third accident occurred about 10:30 Saturday night two miles from Souris on the main highway involving a 1965 car reportedly driven by Weston Rose, East Baltic, and a 1964 half-ton truck said driven by Wilbur Jarvis of Kingsboro. The Jarvis vehicle, which was damaged to the extent of \$110, reportedly hit the Rose vehicle. There were no injuries.

**HALIFAX (CP)** — The weather office says a storm east of Cape Cod was giving rain to all regions of the Maritimes late Monday except Northern New Brunswick where some light snow was falling. The storm will move north-eastward passing through Newfoundland today. The precipitation will gradually diminish over the three provinces today as the storm moves away. Colder air will push into the Maritimes today causing temperatures to fall during the daylight hours at most places.

Another disturbance over the Great Lakes will move eastward to give more wet weather Wednesday. Regional forecasts: Halifax and vicinity, Northern Nova Scotia, Eastern Shore, Prince Edward Island: Overcast; intermittent rain, ending this evening. Turning colder. Northerly winds 25 gusts to 40 diminishing this evening to northwest 15. Early morning and mid afternoon temperatures at Halifax 43 and 38, New Glasgow 40 and 36, Goshen 43 and 36, Charlottetown 36 and 35. Outlook for Wednesday. Overcast. Showers. Little temperature change.

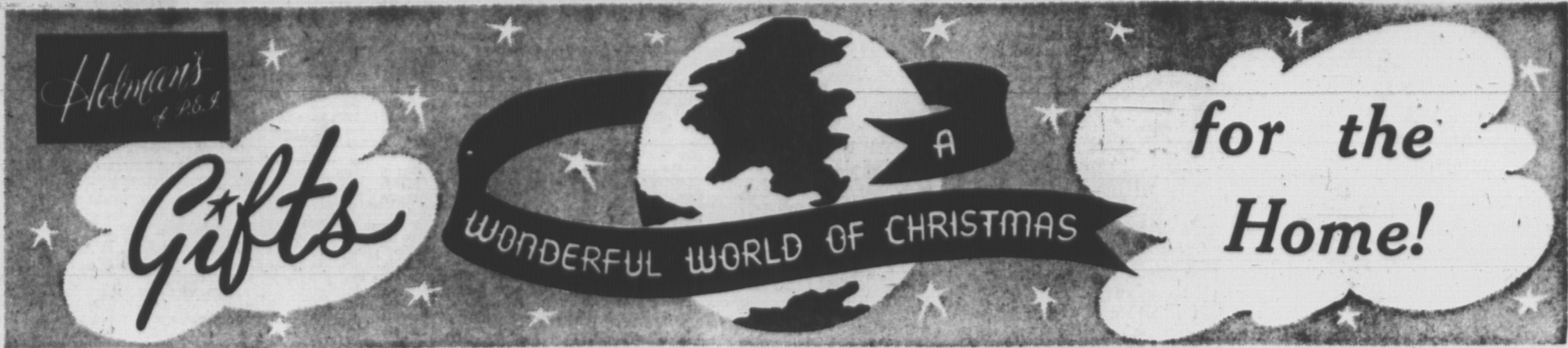
**ENTERS HOSPITAL** — Mrs. Claud Mills, 248 Fitzroy Street has entered the Prince Edward Island Hospital for treatment.
