**Oldest Citizen of Freetown Passes**

The death of Mrs. William Lewis, occurred at her late home, Freetown, on Nov. 19, 1954, following a brief illness, at the age of 92 years. Born in Malpeque December 15, 1862, Annabella MacNeill was the daughter of the late John MacNeill and his wife, Mary Kelly. The MacNeills emigrated from the Mull of Kintyre, Scotland and the Kellys from Northern Ireland. Of a family of seven sisters and two brothers she was the last remaining member.

On February 7, 1884, she was married to William Lewis of Freetown, who predeceased her by eleven years. Of this union two sons were born, Colby C. of Freetown and J. B. with whom she resided. Also surviving are six grandchildren and ten great grandchildren who dearly loved and esteemed their grandmother and who in return were highly respected and loved.

A loyal and devoted member of the Bedouque Baptist Church and the W. M. S. of that place. Of a quiet and patient nature her life was one of devotion to her God, church, home and community. Her home-going was but a happy ending to her prayerful desire.

Funeral services were from her late home. Her pastor, C. A. Britten had charge of the service and gave the address taking as his text Romans VIII 38-39, her testimony in life. W. O. Weale assisted. Fitting tribute was also paid the deceased by her pastor.
