MILWAUKEE, Wis., Oct. 29.—Fully 3300 were made homeless by yesterday's conflagration. WINNIPEG, Oct. 30.—The new crop of potatoes to be raised to 1,834,350 for the season last year. KINGSTON, Oct. 30.—Seventy-five thousand barrels of apples will be exported from Prince Edward County this autumn. The prevailing price is \$1.50 per barrel. Large quantities will go to Boston and England. MONTREAL, Oct. 30.—The Montreal city passenger railway people are expecting a favorable report on Wednesday. L. J. Forget, president, holds 2061 and James Ross, 2623 shares, valued at \$1.22 per share, and these two gentlemen had the destiny of the company in their hands. TORONTO, Oct. 30.—A magistrate in Toronto has amended a plaintiff's writ making Miss Martin a lady counsel, party defendant. This will allow this lady to appear in court and defend the case, despite the refusal of the benchers of the Law Society to admit Miss Martin to practice law. TORONTO, Oct. 30.—There is a rumor in theatrical circles to the effect that the manuscript of the play written by Lord Tennyson is in the possession of E. S. Willard and shortly to be produced by him. Mr. Willard was sent yesterday and stated that he did possess a play by Lord Tennyson, but that he would not like to say that it was the last written by him. OTTAWA, Oct. 30.—A cable having announced that imperial officers have been instructed to trace and slaughter all cattle entering in two recent cargoes in which one suspected animal was found, the minister of agriculture here has ordered an enquiry and reports as to the places here in which those cargoes were purchased, with a view to securing evidence that no pleuro-pneumonia exists in these localities. HALIFAX, Oct. 30.—Four hundred and fifty officers and blue jackets from the warships on the Pacific coast arrived on two special C. P. R. trains to-night. The men were detained at Bedford, but will come into the city to-morrow morning and will immediately embark on the tropic. A similar number of men from the Tyne will board the same trains and at 5 o'clock start on their west bound trip across the continent.

Speak with the mouth about four inches from the transmitter. 2nd. Speak in a moderate tone of voice, not too loud, and distinctly. 3rd. Place the telephone so as to cover the ear, just as if you wished to shut out all other sounds. Do not press too hard on the ear. It is possible to talk and be heard when standing back two or three feet from the transmitter, if you speak loud enough, but it is not a pleasant mode of conversation, is entirely unnecessary, and is a needless waste of wind and lungs, besides being very annoying to all within range of your voice.
