

### Island Flying Service Gets U.S. Approval

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Kennedy approved Tuesday the award of authority to Robert's Flying Service, Troyon P.E.I., to operate a non-scheduled service with light planes between Prince Edward Island and the northeastern United States.

The firm, operated by Robert J. McIlwaine, is allowed to operate in the U.S. north from Virginia and east of Cleveland, Ohio.

The Civil Aeronautics Board granted the company a permit starting Dec. 31, 1952.

President Kennedy also approved a C.A.B. decision renewing until the end of 1957 the permit of Laurentian Air Services, Limited, for similar authority to operate light-plane charter non-scheduled service to points in an even larger area—the eastern half of the U.S.

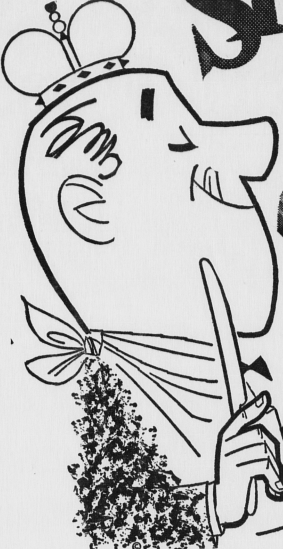
**ROME FROM FRANCE**

**SIGN BORDER TREATY**

PEKING (Reuters) — Communist China and Nepal have signed a formal agreement settling the position of their common border—but it is not yet clear who owns 20,000-foot Mount Everest, the world's highest mountain. 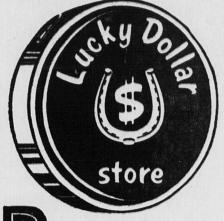
