CLEVELAND ON SILVER.

In reply to a letter from Gov. Northern, asking the President to give his position on financial matters, Mr. Cleveland has sent the following reply:

EXECUTIVE MANSION, Sept. 25.

Hon. W. J. Northern: My Dear Sir:—I hardly know how to reply to your letter of the 15th inst. It is so long that I can only say in a few words that I am quite plain in my record concerning the financial question.

According to an unofficial statement (and there will be no official statement for some time) the Ways and Means Committee of the United States House of Representatives will report in favor of putting on the free list wool, binding twine, cotton bagging, cotton twine, lead, tin, iron and copper ore, coal, unmanufactured timber, salt, hemp, needles, vegetables, meats, game and poultry, eggs, beans and seeds.

There are quite a number of these articles the removal of the duties upon which will be of interest to Canadians, though not to the extent that would have been the case before the operation of the McKinley tariff taught this country that in trade matters, time was little beyond North, and that to an energetic commercial community the refusal of admission to any one market was neither fatal to trade nor a matter of serious loss.
