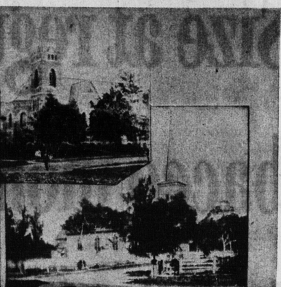
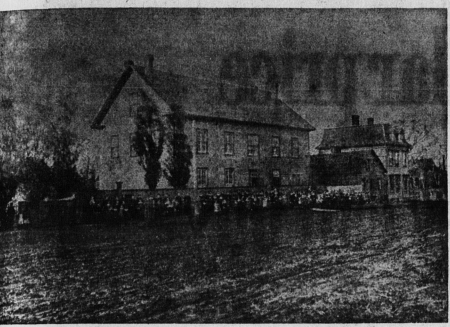
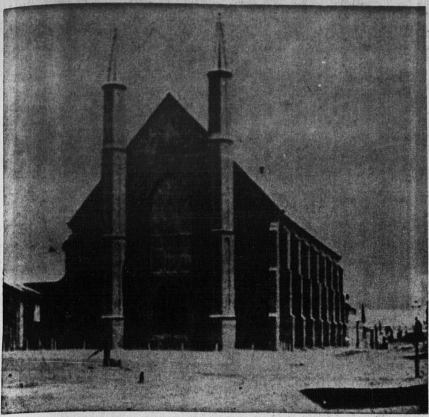


Demolition uncovers some ancient receipts

During the tearing down some years ago of an old building in the central part of the city several ancient receipts were found in a recess between the walls where they had apparently laid for several years. One was made out to Benjamin Davies (father of Sir Louis Davies, late Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Canada) for three pounds eleven shillings for the purchase of sole leather from Cundall and Compton.

It is dated at Charlottetown Oct. 1, 1839. Another one earlier that year was a receipt from George Clarke to Mr. Davies for the purchase of 4 cwt Hard Bread for 5 pounds 12 shillings. In January, 1839, Mr. Davies received instructions "to please buy Laughlin Chisholm 12 shillings in goods". It was signed "J. L. Hay". He also had a receipt from two men for payment of 224 lbs. "hickits". A note to the same Benjamin Davies from John Papineau called attention to a difference in their accounts of 2 pounds 3

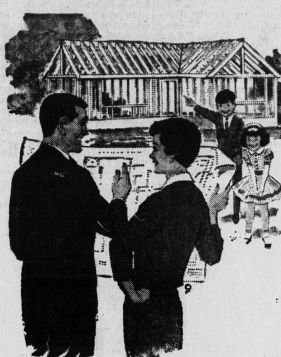

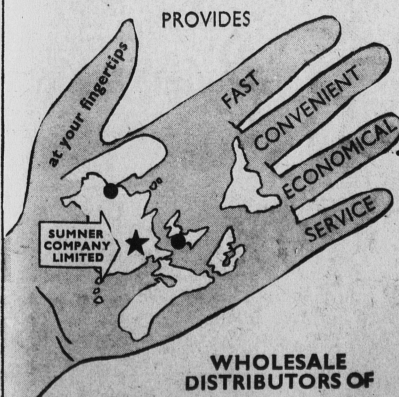

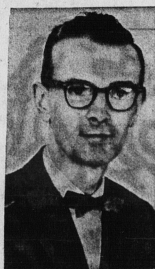
