Four Months For Theft of Stamps

MONTREAL (CP)-Mr. Justice Wilfred Lamure Wednesday sentenced three men to four months in jail each for the theft of \$24,000 in cash, postage and unemployment insurance stamps from the Ville St. Laurent post office Feb. 9.

The men-Georges Buisson, Jean Martin and Gaston Roch-pleaded guilty after having helped recover most of the stolen stamps.

The judge, while passing sentence, said he was taking into consideration the eight months already spent in jail by the accused.

City councillor Lucien Gagnon is charged with receiving the stamps stolen by the men. He disappeared after jumping bail of \$5,000.

AGITATORS ARRESTED

PANJIM, Goa (Reuters)-Portuguese police arrested 25 demonstrators who crossed from India into Goa Thursday in a new attempt to win Goan support for India's claim to sovereignty over Portuguese India. Thirteen of the demonstrators entered the village of Tiracol, whose ancient fort was occupied by Goan "volunteers" last month and then recaptured by the Portuguese. The other 13 entered Satari province.
