Now take dogs, for instance. They are a favorite illustration of mine because it is so clear on this question of heredity. Take a setter and a fox-hound; both have noses equally sharp. And yet hundreds of years back wise men began to breed one dog to smell birds alone and the other to smell four-footed animals alone, and so well have they succeeded that the setter dog is almost oblivious to any other scent but the scent of the bird.

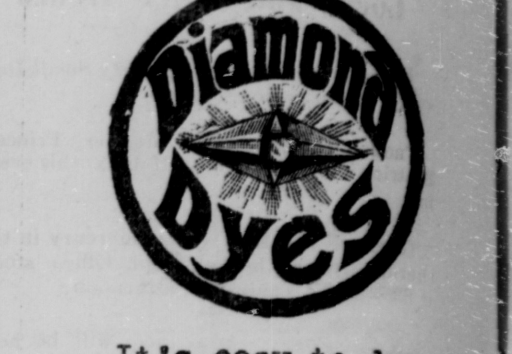
