China with \$3,600 million in military aid, \$205 million in surplus agricultural commodities and \$1,200 million in grants and loans.

It is gratifying to note the success of this pump-priming economically. Since 1955 the country's gross national product has increased at the rate of 6 per cent a year.

Agricultural production has increased 4 per cent annually, and industrial production between 10 and 12 per cent. Reflecting this outstanding growth, the country's export earnings rose 11 per cent in 1962 and 50 per cent in 1963.

Chiang has not always shown gratitude for American aid by refraining from the kind of sabre-rattling that gives Washington, and Washington's allies, the jitters.

Perhaps, with the economic improvement now achieved in Nationalist China, its ruler's thoughts will be diverted more to the welfare of his people, and less to seeking revival a struggle that could plunge the world into another war.

Safety Code Needed
Hon. I. Angus MacLean has called attention in Parliament to the need for a national safety code with respect to automobiles.

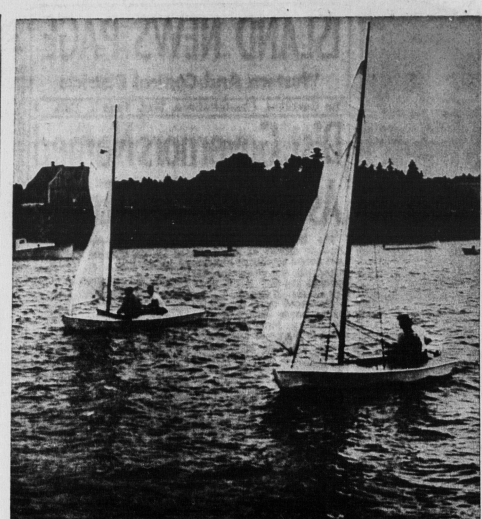

HABEAS CORPUS
Important Step To Amend Civil Rights

Last Friday afternoon the House of Commons took an important step to extend the civil rights of Canadians. It passed a private member's bill which inserted three words, "or habeas corpus", into Section 98 of the Criminal Code, and thereby made possible from a habeas corpus decision by a judge.

Living body of the prisoner before the court. The judge will then inquire into the legality of the detention, and if he finds it to be illegal the prisoner will be released.

At one time a person making an application under habeas corpus could, if the first judge to whom he applied refused to release him, continue to make applications to judge after judge.
