Value of Land Propert in France. The value of landed property in France, is estimated at \$24,468,020,000. This estimate is found on its rental and market value, and does not include the buildings thereon. The net revenue obtained from lands in France is \$200,405,000, and the investment in rural property yields a return of only 5.89 per cent. The rural property of France is divided into six great categories, viz: Superior lands, such as orchards, hemp fields, and gardens; arable lands, property so called; pasture, meadow, or grazing lands; vine lands, timber, and lands or commons more or less cultivated;
