Butter Supplies Likely Ample For Next Winter

OTTAWA, Aug. 17 - (CP) - Government butter will be cheaper next winter than it was a year ago and there likely will be enough of it - along with commercial stockpiles - to eliminate the need for butter imports, agricultural officials said Wednesday.

They based this estimate on current production trends, the government stockpile that is being built up under Federal price-support and the lower price the government is offering to the producer, 58 cents a pound wholesale against 63 cents last year.

Government butter retailed at about 70 cents a pound last winter. It may run to about 65 cents during the next cold spell, officials said.

Though it's offering less money to the producer, the government is getting a lot more butter under the 58-cent-a-pound price-price-support program than it did in 1951, though how much is a secret.

Last year it set so little butter and commercial supplies were so skimpy that the government, armed with legislation which virtually gave it a monopoly on butter imports, brought in 12,500,000 pounds from New Zealand and European sources. The trade shipped in 4-

500,000 pounds before the government slipped the noose on imports. That made for a total of 17,000,000 pounds imported. Some of this was sold on the domestic market, but the government didn't get rid of all its imports, ending up with a surplus of about 8,500,000 pounds when the new production season opened last spring.

Butter still is under import control. Meanwhile, with the market for Canadian dairy cows cut by the United States embargo on Canadian cattle and meats, more cows are being milked in Canada this summer and butter production is being built up.

Creamery butter production during the first seven months of 1952 climbed to 159,230,000 pounds, up 12,711,000 from 146,519,000 in the same period last year. Output during July increased seven per cent to 39,000,000 pounds from 36,339,000 in July, 1951.

Consumption during July increased to 26,634,000 pounds from 27,000,000 last year and in the seven-month period climbed to 151,795,000 from 144,622,000. The Canadian stockpile of butter on Aug. 1 stood at 56,865,000 pounds an increase of about 11,000,000 pounds from 45,940,000 a year ago.

Forecast Possible Drop In U. K. Living Costs

By Ronald Williams LONDON, Aug. 17 - (Reuters) - The government Tuesday forecast a possible drop in Britain's high cost of living - if wages stay at present levels.

Cheaper materials might bring a fall in prices of clothing and manufactured household goods. These items account for 20 per cent of wage-earners' pay packets. Treasury experts also said the prices should at least remain stable and might even drop on a wide range of goods from coal to vegetables and from beer to tobacco.

But the experts included the big if. If wages go up, their predictions about the cost of living must go out the window.

And wage increases are likely. Nearly 9,000,000 workers have claims in for pay boosts. The pressure on the government's wage-restraint policy is increasing. The treasury forecast, made in its bulletin for industry, coupled its warning against granting wage demands with another note of caution by saying many falls might be offset by other price increases.

An expected rise in transport fares and electricity charges also figure on the debit side of the ledger. Tuesday's treasury statement came after price cuts announced by tea and automobile firms.

Two of the largest tea firms here are reducing prices between two pence and five pence a pound Sept. 7. Two other large firms have been operating similarly reduced charges for the last month.

On cars, the biggest cut announced today was by the Rootes group. Price of its Humber Super Snipe model is slashed by £35 to £1,290 (including £462 purchase tax in the home market). The Jowett Car Company followed suit with price cuts between £45 and £22.

Many dealers here believe these price-cutting moves will grow, especially among higher-priced cars.

NEW YORK, Aug. 17 - (AP) - Is the summer bull market in stocks coming to an end? It hasn't yet, but brokers are keeping their fingers crossed.

Last week the stock market was hit by one of the sharpest slumps in the three months that this present phase of the bull market has been under way.

The down-beat, however, cannot in itself be considered anything more than a minor jog in the market pattern. It would have to take on a more severely bearish aspect before it could write the end of the summer bull market.

Something like 80 per cent of the week's fall was concentrated in the Tuesday session. The rest of the time the market marked time in a mixed to slightly lower manner. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks lost \$1 on the week and closed at \$108.70.

The total at a little more than 5,000,000 shares was the lowest for a full week since the second week in May when everything stood still while the United States Supreme Court heard arguments on the government seizure of the steel industry. That week in turn was the lowest full week in three years.

U.S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, Aug. 17 - (AP) - Steel Magazine says today the shortages in various types of steel may not last so long, after all.

The weekly metalworking publication, which previously had predicted shortages of several months' duration in nearly all major steel products, says present reports indicate the scarcities will be of short duration.

For one thing, Steel says, the steel mills in the United States are recovering quickly from the effects of the recent country-wide strike. Last week the mills increased their production rate 5.5 points to 94.5 per cent of theoretical capacity.

Warehouses report finished steel is reaching them in heavier volume than expected. Many sheet consumers had a fair cushion of inventories to meet a rather restricted volume of needs.

Uranium Rush Almost Over

REGINA, Aug. 17 - (CP) - The first great uranium rush in the atomic age is almost over. What mining men have described as "the most intensive" mineral rush in Northern America in this century has pretty well run its course in the Beaverlodge uranium field of Northwestern Saskatchewan.

Last week more than 1,000 men scamped over the mountains and granite ridges in search of the fortune-bearing pitchblende ore. There were grizzled old prospectors who had switched gold pans for geiger counters, geologists who knew the mining game backwards and the fly-by-night "nuisance" stakers hoping to pick up ground for a quick turnover.

A small-scale uranium rush did take place in Ontario's Sault Ste. Marie area four years ago, but it was dwarfed by the Beaverlodge rush of a week ago.

Sourdoings of the gold-mining era would see a vast difference between last week's uranium rush and the "roaring nineties." Guns and fists were not used to settle arguments.

In sharp contrast to the sourdoings who have spent most of their lives in the wilderness were the cheechakees—the greenhorns. Among the beginners were Count and Countess de Nodzelewski, who arrived in Canada from Paris 13 months ago. After honing up on geology in Montreal, they left for Northern Saskatchewan.
