Kings County Stipendiary Magistrate, James B. Johnston, presided at the sitting of the Magistrate's court in Georgetown on Wednesday.

An adjournment of two weeks was granted in the case of Lewis Allan Joseph Acorn of Lower Montague charged under the Excise Act. Following a plea of not guilty the Crown evidence was heard at an earlier sitting of the court. The revenue department is represented by Melvin J. McQuaid of Souris and J.P. Nicholson of Charlottetown represented the accused.

Crown evidence has been completed in this case. The accused is represented by Mr. Nicholson.
