Hamilton Tiger-Cats assured themselves of at least a tie for first place in the Big Four Football League when they earned a 15-7 victory Saturday over the Alouettes in Montreal.
In Ottawa, the Rough Riders gained sole possession of second place by arousing Toronto Argonauts 25-7 before 12,440 spectators.
The Tiraos now lead the Riders by four points. Alouettes are third and Argos are out of the playoff picture.
Kitchener Waterloo Dutchmen moved into first place in the Senior ORFU with a 18-14 victory over Sarnia Golden Bears. The Dutchmen lead London Lords by one point and are four up on the third-place Bears. Toronto Balmy Beaches are winless.

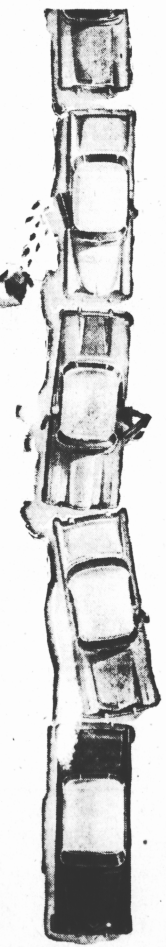
