Kennedy Leaves Monday

AN ISLANDER who looks at home either chugging around the baselines or speeding down the ice, Forbes Kennedy, leaves for London, Ontario, Monday and training camp with the NHL Boston Bruins.

"I figure I have a good chance of sticking with Boston this year," Forbes said yesterday. "I've had to work every fall for my job in the NHL, and I won't stop working this season. Of course it's all about what around the league. I figure all of the guys in the league there are less than 40 who don't have to really worry about their job."

Forbes, at 29 years of age, will be going to NHL training camp for the fourth time. He's been with Toronto, Chicago, Detroit and now Boston. Last season he was one of the Bruins' "tough guys" and picked up 30 minutes in penalties while collecting eight goals and 17 assists. He played all 70 games.

"I was at my best ever for the last half of last season," Forbes said. "The Bruins had me playing center, right and left wing and killing penalties. This season I'd like to have a regular job, but if I have to, I'll play anywhere."

Kennedy played defence in the NHL, only once. "I was in a regular job, but I was in practice for two or three weeks with the idea of making me a defenceman because I could skate backwards, handle the puck and body check," he said. "My opportunity came in Detroit one day, the third when we were training Montreal 7-2. They put me on the point and everything was fine until the second, until I looked up and found that I was the only guy back and Jean Beliveau was breaking in on me."

"I went, and just didn't make my play on Beliveau. I fell flat on my rear. I was lucky though I guess because Jean had my severe sinusitis and he was laughing at me pretty good. That was my last crack at defence."

In Good Condition

SO MUCH for Forbes' defensive debut. I don't think he'll be laughed at in the NHL too much anymore.

The 37-year-old Kennedy weighs 185 lbs. He weighed the same when he finished with the Bruins in Toronto, Chicago, Detroit and now Boston. He's been working on a bicycle for the past three weeks to bring him back in good working order, he likes to be liked.

The Bruins have three forwards they didn't have at the end of last season: Fleming Mc Donald and Balfour Forbes. But Forbes says he isn't worried about beating out any of them for a position on the team.
