**Astronomers Given Awards**  
OTTAWA (CP) — Dr. C. S. Beals, Dominion astronomer, and two well-known Canadian amateur astronomers received special awards here Friday night at the annual meeting of the Royal Astronomical Society of Canada.

Beals, Beals, society secretary awards went to Rev. M. W. Burke-Gaffney, professor of science and history at Saint Mary's University, Halifax, and W. T. Goddard of Hamilton, Ont.

The service awards were granted infrequently by the society in recognition of work done in the field of astronomy.

Patrick Burke-Gaffney's citation said he was a prime mover in the founding of the Non-Sectarian Astronomical Society in 1951. As a result of his efforts this society three years later became the national centre of the Royal Astronomical Society.

# NATO's Secretary-General Will Visit Greece, Turkey

The HAGUE (CP) — NATO Secretary-General Herge Stikker announced here he will go to Greece and Turkey again soon in connection with the NATO mission to maintain a "watching brief" on those countries over their dilatory attitude towards the Stikker, answering correspondent's questions at the close of the NATO ministerial meeting which authorized the "watching" mission.

The communiqué issued after the close of the ministerial meeting made no direct mention of the question of the Cyprus problem but expressed the concern of all 15 foreign ministers over the disorders on Cyprus, adding that "they reaffirmed the full support of their governments for the action decided on by the United Nations with a view to restoring law and order, and for the efforts of the mediator appointed by the United Nations to seek an agreed solution of the problem."

External Affairs Minister Martin of Canada, who headed the Cyprus debate as a matter of immediate urgency, said he was "satisfied" with the communiqué although it was couched in vague terms in the day of all communiques.

Martin spoke with reporters briefly before leaving for a three-day visit to Bonn and Berlin with West Germany's Foreign Minister Gerhard Schröder.

**AIM ACHIEVED**  
Martin noted that he had said earlier in the week that the NATO ministers should not be content with a mere discussion of the Cyprus issue.

"I felt there had to be some continuing machinery by which our continuing concern could be expressed and dealt with. This has been done."

He emphasized that NATO has no mediation role in Cyprus and the Cyprus festival.

**AID SUSPENDED**  
PARIS (Reuters) — All current agreements between France and Tunisia, including the 1958 financial aid, have been suspended since the Tunisian sources here said Tuesday. The report of suspension of aid followed the passing by the Tunisian National Assembly Monday night of a bill nationalizing all foreign-owned assets and the law chiefly affects Frenchmen.
