### Joost Named Playing Manager Of Athletics

PHILADELPHIA. (AP) — Shortstop Eddie Joost was named playing manager of Philadelphia Athletics Wednesday to succeed Jimmy Dykes who hadn't been informed of the switch.

Roy Mack, vice-president of the Athletics, said Dykes was summoned for a morning conference with the club owners—but failed to appear. He still hadn't shown up when the announcement of Joost's appointment was released.

Terms were not disclosed but it was believed that Joost, 37, will get more than \$25,000.

Dykes said: "I know absolutely nothing about the switch. It came as a complete surprise."

Joost is the third man ever to be named to manage the A's; Connie Mack was field boss for 50 years and was succeeded by Dykes in 1951.

Mack said it was important to make the change because of the A's showing this season. Philadelphia finished seventh, far below the leaders.

Mack said Dykes "will be asked to remain in an advisory capacity for the one-year his contract still has to run."

The white spruce of the St. Lawrence region is used for timber as well as pulp.

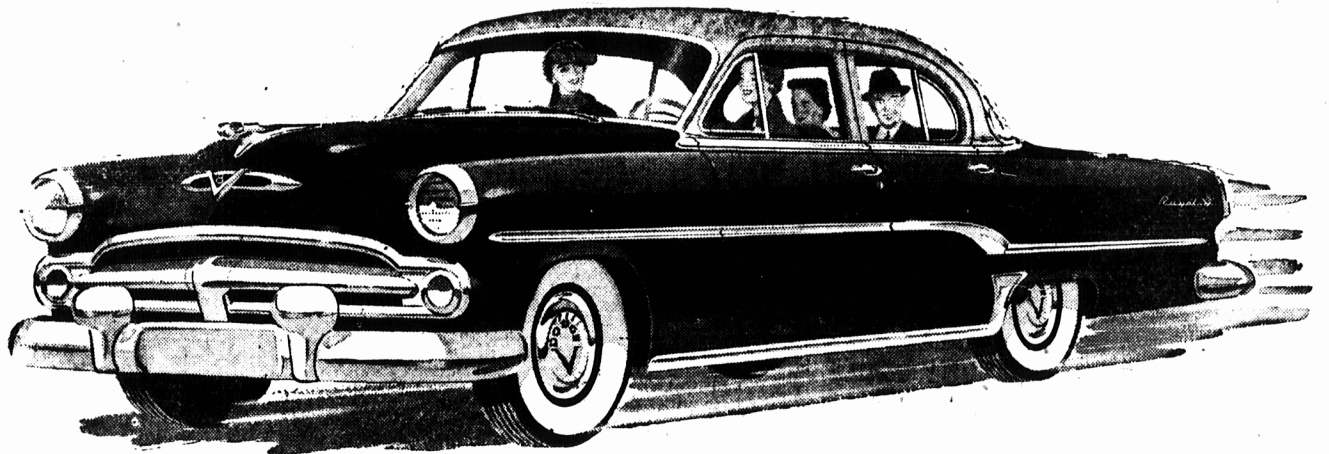
### Bones Raleigh New Captain Of Rangers

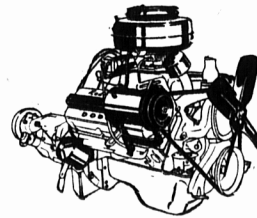

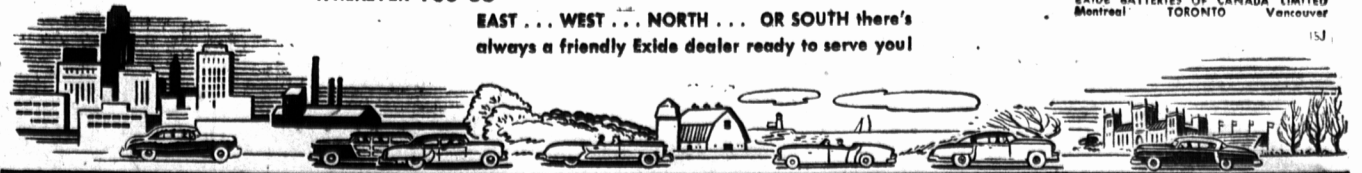

NEW YORK. (AP) — New York Rangers of the National Hockey League Tuesday called up defenceman Ivan (the Terrible) Irwin from Vancouver Canucks and sent their captain and defenceman Allan Stanley to the Western Hockey League farm club as a replacement.

Stanley has been with the Rangers since the 1948-49 season. New York fans have been razzing him all season.

### Island Odds And Ends

During a two day period, Wednesday and Thursday, fifty men were recruited for work in Labrador, at the Charlottetown office of the National Employment Service. More than half of these were laborers but some were carpenters, and a few were gas-engine or Diesel mechanics. Many more carpenters were needed but were not obtainable.

Hiring of the men was done by a company representative who came to Charlottetown expressly for this purpose. He had previously visited Summerside where interviews with applicants continued throughout Monday and Tuesday.

All of the men are medically examined and x-rayed before acceptance. The medical examiner for the Charlottetown area is Dr. W. J. P. MacMillan.

More than a hundred men applied for work but many were laborers, and the quota for this type of work was limited, and many were turned away.

The quotas for carpenters, electricians, sheet-metal workers and mechanics were not filled, and the company's agent has now returned to Moncton.

All of the men who were accepted will be leaving the province within a week or ten days. Transportation warrants will be forwarded to the National Employment office from Moncton for each of the individuals concerned, and all will be notified of the date of departure.

A proportion of the men are "rehire", men who worked in Labrador before, and whose services had been satisfactory. The Company maintains a list of all former workmen, and a notation follows each name, designating the man as eligible or ineligible, for further employment.

The men plan to remain in the North country throughout the winter and early spring. It is understood that no further recruiting will be carried out in this Province until next spring.
