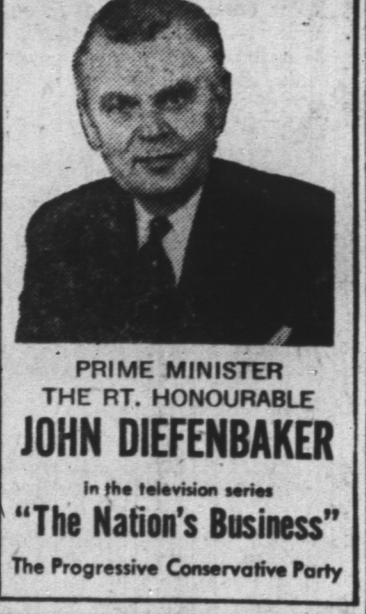

Opening lead-nine of spades

Suppose you're playing a four heart contract and West leads a spade which you ruff. What would you do next?

The most natural thing to do is get to dummy with a diamond, lead the nine of hearts, and finesse. West takes the king and leads another spade. You ruff it and draw two more rounds of trumps.

By now, whether you realize it or not, you have only one trump left. Let's say you lead a club because you have to build up a club trick to make the hand.

When you ruff, you're out of trumps, and the best you can do now is cash three diamonds, after which you will have to concede two tricks to the defenders because one of them has a high club and a good spade.

Down one is the story. Could you have done anything about it? Yes. The trump shortage that developed could have been anticipated. It was bound to occur if the heart finesse lost. Steps should therefore have been taken to maintain control of trumps.

At trick two the best lead is a club. Assuming this is done and West wins the king and returns a spade. South ruffs and plays another club. East takes it and leads still another spade. Declarer ruffs and now has three trumps left.

He crosses to dummy with a diamond and takes a heart finesse. West wins with the king (it does him no good to duck). But a spade return is ineffective because it can be ruffed in dummy, and any other lead also gives declarer the rest of the tricks. So South makes ten tricks as a result of tacking clubs before trumps.

The point is that the heart finesse, if it is on, will work late as well as early. Even if the defense gets a club ruff, the heart finesse is still available. But playing hearts too soon dooms the contract any time West has the king.

French TV Station Set At Moncton

OTTAWA (CP) - The CBC's third French-language television station, CBAFT Moncton, N.B., will go on the air next Monday, it was announced this week.

Until the microwave network is extended from Rimouski, Que., to Moncton, expected by Jan. 1, 1961, French network programs will be carried mainly from kinescopic recordings and films, the CBC said. Local live programs also will be carried.

For a brief period on weekdays, the French network will use English-language microwave facilities to carry network programs to Moncton. The microwave system to the east is not used for brief periods in late afternoon when Atlantic area stations carry local programs.

The other CBC French TV stations are CBFMT Montreal and CBOFT Ottawa.

Defamation Threatened

VANCOUVER (CP) - Counsel for Weldon Chan said Tuesday he is prepared to launch defamation suits against Immigration Minister Fairclough and MP Douglas Jung if Chan gives him the go-ahead.

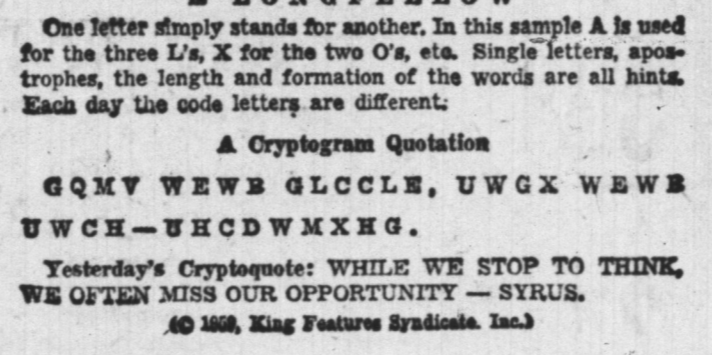
Lawyer Harry E. S. Fan, acting for Mr. and Mrs. Chan and their five-year-old daughter who have been ordered deported to Hong Kong, said in an interview: "I am ready to start the actions as soon as I hear from my client. That could be any minute."

The whereabouts of the 40-year-old Chan has not been known since Nov. 2 when he left his Vancouver home ostensibly to seek an interview with Mrs. Fairclough in Ottawa. Chan is believed somewhere in Eastern Canada.

INDIRECT CONTACT
Mr. Fan said Chan may get in touch with him by mail, sending a letter to a friend in Vancouver and having the friend drop it into the lawyer's office.

The defamation actions would concern statements made last week by Mrs. Fairclough and Mr. Jung in connection with the Chan case. Mrs. Fairclough, after an interview with Mrs. Chan in Ottawa, said last Thursday that Chan would be deported to his native Hong Kong. In a statement, she said: "Weldon Chan has on successive occasions broken the law of this country; he has indeed attempted to make a mockery of the law that it is my duty to uphold. Deportation of Mr. and Mrs. Chan and their daughter will therefore be carried out as soon as Mr. Chan is located. Mr. Jung, Canada's only Chinese member of Parliament, said in a letter to a West Vancouver woman that in his opinion any merit in Chan's case vanished when the man left his wife and child.

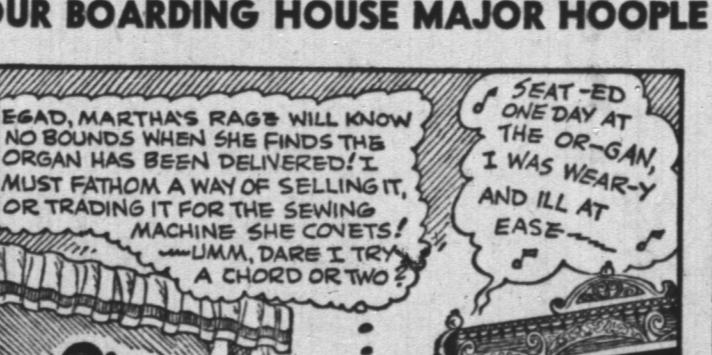

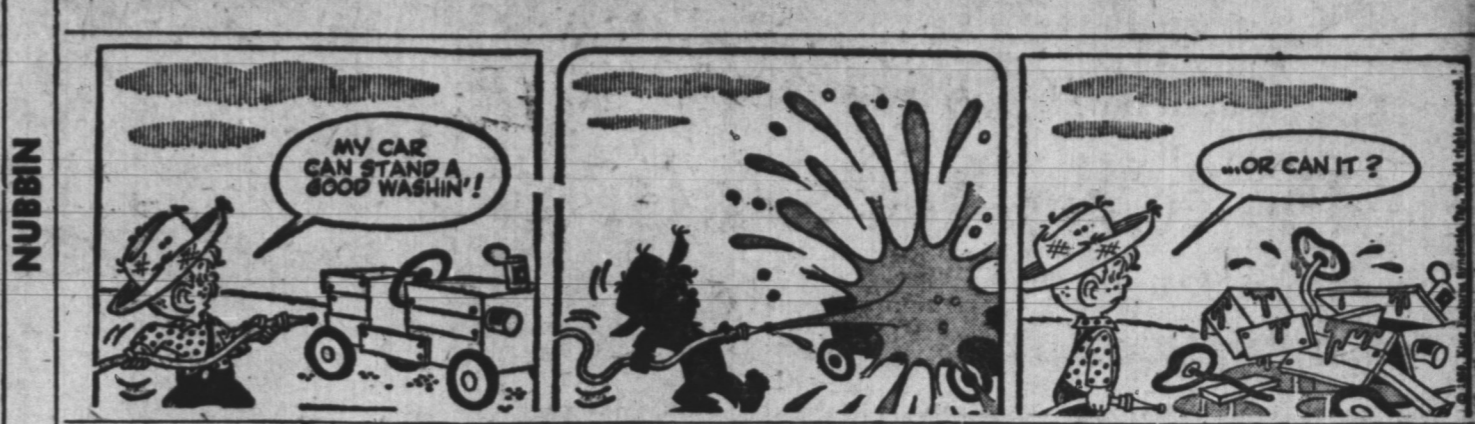
