Royal Bank Always Seeks Expansion In Caribbean

MONTEREAL, CP.—We are always looking for ways to expand our business there, said R. W. Shannon, general manager of international operations for the Royal Bank of Canada, referring to the bank's expansion in the Caribbean area.

His comment followed the opening of the bank's new branch in the French islands of Guadeloupe and Martinique in the bank's wholly-owned subsidiary, Royal Bank of Canada Finance, located in Paris.

In tracing Royal's international expansion, including a few setbacks such as Cuba, he said:

"The total of our branches outside Canada reached a high of 119 in 1925 but during the depression years and the war this total was gradually reduced to 67 at the end of the Second World War."

Since then the bank has moved steadily forward and now operates 103 international branches throughout the Caribbean including the Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, Haiti, Bahamas, Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago, British Guiana the West Indies and British Honduras.

Through a series of purchases of foreign banks Royal has branches in Venezuela, Brazil, Argentina, Colombia and Peru and in many years has operated branches in New York, London and Paris.

Competition in Royal's various fields of international operations is provided by British, American and Canadian banks as well as local institutions.

Mr. Shannon, 50, a graduate of Queen's University, joined the Royal Bank in 1937, and, while he hasn't worked in international branches, has travelled extensively since joining the international division 14 years ago.

He has been in charge of international operations for four years, the first three as associate general manager and last year during a reshuffle of titles was appointed general manager.

The bank's international ventures started when a branch was opened in Bermuda in 1882, but this was closed in 1889 due to a change in laws which made it unattractive for us to continue operations," said Mr. Shannon.

A second foreign branch was started on the French islands of St. Pierre-Miquelon, off the shores of Newfoundland in 1888, but this was closed five years later owing to what the bank termed "dangerous bankruptcy laws in force on the island."
