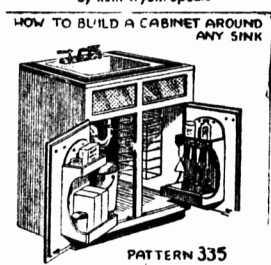

Russian News Comments On Pearson's Visit

LONDON CP — The Russian newspaper Izvestia, commenting on External Affairs Minister Pearson's visit to Moscow, makes a strong bid for expanded Canadian-Soviet trade.

The Canadian minister, now on a round-the-world trip, flew from Berlin to Moscow today to begin a week's visit. Says the Izvestia story, broadcast by Moscow radio: "Canada is today a developed industrial-agrarian country, successfully competing with France and Western Germany in many economic fields. Canada's artificial severance from the markets of such countries as the U.S.S.R., the People's Republic of China, and the European Peoples' Dem-

ocracies cannot but unfavorably affect her economic prospects especially if we take into account the importance of foreign markets for any capitalist country. The expansion of Canadian-Soviet trade could greatly benefit the economies of both countries." The Izvestia article briefs views the developments of the war and hails a new spirit in international relations.

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
