CURRENCIES
MONTREAL (CP) - The U.S. dollar closed Thursday at a discount of 3 1/2 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, up 1-32. Pound sterling \$2.72 3/4, up 1-16.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) - The stock market was easier at the close, but still ended on the upside in heavy trading Thursday.
Final volume of 3,005,000 shares was the heaviest since May 8 and compared with Wednesday's 2,855,000.

Gold had established 1958 highs in mid-afternoon trading but fell off as profit taking occurred in the last hour. They were ahead of the one-quarter point on the day. Base metals were ahead of a half point while western oils were down almost a point.

Among Coppers, Cocco added 1/4 at 13 1/2 and Bethlehem gained 15 cents at 20 cents. Margalo, the heaviest traded mining issue, advanced five cents on a turnover of 200,000 shares.

Hollinger and Kerr-Addison led junior golds while juniors gained 1/4 to 10-cent range.
Bailey Selburn was one of the heavier losers among oils, dipping 20 cents at \$6.60. Several issues were starting to move ahead at the close but changes were small.

MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP) - Prices strengthened gradually as trading on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Thursday drew to a close.

Brews, steels, papers, base metals and banks advanced.
Pace-setters were Molsons B, up 3/4 at 33; Canadian Iron Foundry, up 1 at 28; Bowater, up 25 cents at a new high of 4.10, and Banque Canadienne Nationale gaining 1/2 at 42.

Bucking the trend were Stelco at 37 1/2 and Canada Steamship Lines at 35 1/2, each down 1/2 and Abitibi, slipping 5/8 to 28 1/2.
Other industrials were generally mixed.

Western oils were mixed, Canadian Atlantic Oil slipping 10 cents to 4.70 while Central Del Rio rose the same amount to 8.00.
Producing mines slipped. Placer dropped 60 cents to 9.90, but Hollinger gained 1/2 point at 23.

MONTREAL CLOSING STOCKS

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NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - Steels set the pace for a brisk stock market rise Thursday but tobacco was upstated late in the session.
Key stocks went ahead from fractions to a point or more. Tobacco shares took losses of 2 or 3 points.

Steels were bolstered by the rising production rate in the industry and predictions by some steel executives of a price boost.
Most aircrafts, coppers, motors, oils and leading rails were ahead.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 70 cents to \$169.30, with industrials up \$1.30, rails up 20 cents and utilities up 30 cents.
