Jr. Red Cross Remembers Needy, Crippled Children

Junior Red Cross members in the province are playing Santa Claus again this year to the needy and crippled children on the Island. The annex at Red Cross headquarters in Charlottetown resembles the toy department of a store these days as toys and games collected by JRC members in more than 100 Island schools arrive to be wrapped and prepared for mailing or delivery in "Santa Claus boxes". There are books for very young and older children, puzzles, coloring books and crayons, cutouts, blocks, all kinds of games, padlocks and dolls. There are toys that wind up or float, and even a hula hoop doll and a pair of toy snow shoes. Another kind of toy is the stuffed animal or doll made in the schools.

In addition to the school donations the Red Cross bought some new things, as well as candy, from the fund for needy children. When buying toys they try to get those of an educational or therapeutic value such as modelling clay or beads to be strung by crippled children. Other expenses such as Christmas paper also come out of this fund. Christmas stockings were cut out at headquarters and decorated and filled at the city schools. One stocking goes to each box.

A box for the individual boy or girl might contain a truck or doll, a coloring book and crayons, a game, and story-book as well as the stocking and candy. One sample family box contained skates, a doll, a number of stuffed toys, games, cars, puzzles and school supplies. The idea is to send something for every child. There are permanent lists at Red Cross headquarters or from a public health nurse. The boxes are mailed or delivered if they are within driving distance. About 300 boxes were sent out last year. Mrs. Eunice Reid said, and probably about the same number will be sent this year. It is often the case, Mrs. Reid added, that these are the only toys the children get from Santa. "I think it is one of the nicest things we do".
