BONN (AP) - Booming West Germany's exports increased by 20 per cent in the first six months of this year over the same period of 1953, the federal statistical office announced Sunday. Exports during the January-June period of 1954 totalled 12,058,000,000 marks (\$2,867,000,000). Imports increased by 15 per cent to a total of 11,172,000,000 marks (\$2,410,460,000).

## Markets

**New York Stocks**  
NEW YORK (AP) - Stocks last week ended the 11th month of a bellowing bull market, and there were few signs of faltering.

It was in mid-September of last year that the market hit the bottom of a long slide and turned upward sharply.

It has held to a swift pace for 11 months with only occasional slips that look like small corrections along the way.

The previous week's market took a heard tumble but last week it turned around and shot ahead with vigor. The recovery had such vitality that the importance of the previous shakeout dimmed considerably.

**TRADING BUSIER**  
The daily average trading so far this year is around 2,051,000 shares compared with a daily average total of 1,413,000 shares last year. The current rate of trading is the greatest since 1933 when the daily average was 2,518,000.

The market has consistently reacted favorably to good news items and it has isolated bad news to individual stocks or small groups.

## Texan Threatens To Fly Under Eiffel Tower

**LE HARVE, France (Reuters)** - A 30-year-old Texan who flew a tiny sports plane under London Bridge to impress his girl friend has threatened to fly under Paris' Eiffel Tower next year - unless she marries him.

Tall Gene Thompson of Lubbock, a former U.S. air force pilot and Korean war veteran, voiced the threat in his ship cabin just before the Panamanian liner Atlantic sailed for Quebec and New York Thursday.

At his side was shapely, blue-eyed Helen Brown, 22, a student at Lubbock's Texas Technical College. She declined to say whether Thompson's daredevil feat Wednesday or his Eiffel Tower threat have won her heart.

Thompson flew between the up-rights of Tower Bridge and under the main span of London Bridge in a rented plane.

The blonde Miss Brown wore a form-fitting sweater and blue skirt. French photographers couldn't get enough pictures.

**AFFECTIONATE, BUT...**  
She appeared on affectionate terms with Thompson despite her non-committal attitude on marriage. Asked why he flew under the bridges, the pilot said seriously:

"I want to marry Helen but Helen just wouldn't take up her mind. I did this because I wanted to do something mad to show her how I felt."

Thompson said his future employment is as much up in the air as his romance and hinted his stunt could be connected with both problems.

"The first thing I must do at home is to find a job," he said. "I spent my last \$10 to hire the plane yesterday."

## Release Mental Health Statistics

**OTTAWA, (CP)** - The majority of mental patients released from hospital have been under treatment for relatively short periods, the bureau of statistics says.

More than one-quarter of mental patients leaving institutions last year had been patients less than a month and more than two-thirds had been patients for three months or less. Only 13 per cent had been receiving hospital treatment for longer than a year.

The figures were contained in the latest report on mental health statistics.

A record number of patients were discharged, 17,658 or 10 per cent above 1952. About 18 per cent were classified as recovered and another 65 as improved, while 11 per cent were discharged without improvement. Nearly six per cent of the total left against medical advice.

**MORE DEATHS**  
Meanwhile, deaths in mental institutions increased to 3,556, a rise of 8.5 per cent from 1952. Their average length of treatment had been nearly seven years, but the bureau reported that relatively few died of the mental condition for which they were sent to hospital.

The main causes of death were heart disease and pneumonia. The bureau also reported that during

**SOUTHAMPTON, England, (CP)** - Fruil-vington Harold Marshall, 3 of Collingwood, Ont., has been sentenced to three months in prison for stowing away aboard a liner Queen Elizabeth.

Marshall, who calls himself "free-lance orthodox Christian" but sometimes shortens it to "Naure Boy," was taken from the New York-bound liner several weeks ago. Last week he told the court he wanted to go to the United States to maintain his supply of free fruit.

He complained Thursday: "I feel my health is deteriorating through detention and from the fact that I am being fed on milk and not being provided with tree and vine-ripened fresh, sweet fruit."

The magistrate told Marshall he could count on good, ordinary food in prison.
