

A Scene in the British House of Commons.

Correspondence of the New York Herald. Mr. Gladstone's Government, having suppressed the troublesome Parnellites, the Ministry looked forward with confidence to completing all the stages of the Crime Bill.

THE DIVISION was taken. The House presented a crowded and animated appearance. There was a flutter of excitement on the benches, the Conservatives looking confident, while the Liberals were visibly depressed and demoralized.

THE HUMILIATION OF THE GOVERNMENT was increased by the fact that the Ministerial emissaries had approached the Irish members in full view of the House, and had brought back their refusal to interfere further in the proceedings.

CONSERVATIVES WERE EXCITED AND JOYOUS. Sir Stafford Northcote threw off for a moment the tea-party aspect which has gained him the title of "The Grand Old Man."

MR. GLADSTONE ROSE immediately, and said that under ordinary circumstances, after such a division, he would have asked the House to postpone the consideration of the measure, but seeing the extraordinary condition of Ireland he should, without prejudice of anything he had said, ask them to proceed with it.
