Searching Inflation Study Made By Senate Committee

By ALAN DONNELLY Canadian Press Staff Writer OTTAWA (CP) — A searching six-week study of the problem of inflation has been concluded by the Senate finance committee. The committee's report follows the opinion of many of its witnesses, part of the blame for inflationary pressures will be placed on deficit government spending. Criticism of ever-increasing government spending cropped up repeatedly as the committee, in 10 meetings, heard spokesmen from a wide range of groups in the finance, commercial, industrial and labor fields. For instance James Muir, president of the Royal Bank of Canada, and J. Douglas Gibson, Bank of Nova Scotia general manager, both said federal spending should be held down. Mr. Gibson said record federal spending and big deficits have created a fear of inflation among Canadians. 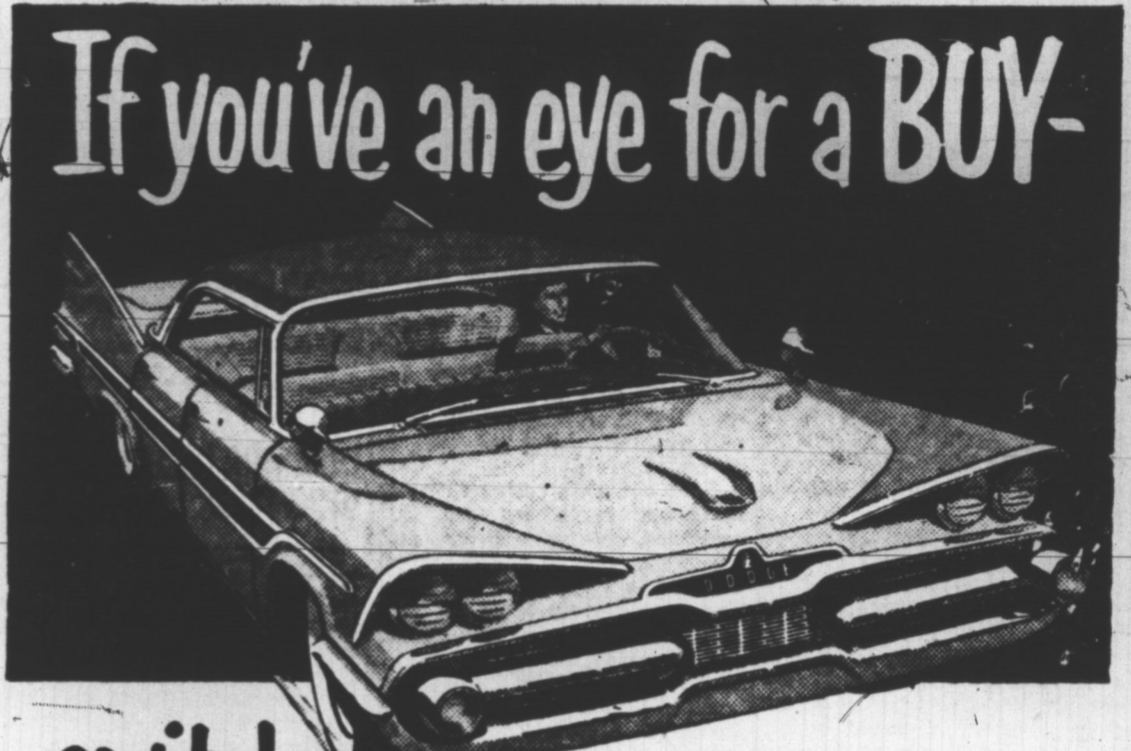
Canada Assures Secretary Herter

He received this pledge at a three-hour meeting with Prime Minister Diefenbaker and External Affairs Minister Green during a six-hour stopover in Ottawa en route to next week's Big Four talks in Geneva. A brief communique issued after the meeting said "matters of general international concern were considered as well as subjects of special interest to the United States and Canada." The communique did not elaborate on the Canada-U.S. problems discussed. However, they would include issues in the field of trade, purchases of uranium by the U.S. after 1962 and Joint Canadian - American power development of British Columbia's Columbia River. WINNIPEG SPEECH While the communique did not refer to the international matters discussed, Mr. Diefenbaker said in Winnipeg Saturday night at a Ukrainian rally: "I have come away from these talks reinforced in my conviction of the united purpose underlying the Western position, and in my conviction that it is consistent in every way with the attitude and principles Canada has maintained throughout the Berlin crisis." He added: "We believe in the continued need of negotiation, but not in the sacrifice of people who stand for freedom. Let this be clear. The Canadian government, speaking for all Canadians, will not agree to the abandonment of the people of Berlin, or to the sacrifice of Western rights or to any retreat from Western responsibilities."
