The accident occurred about 4:30 p.m. when the car was reportedly proceeding down the grade towards Summerside. Dr. L. K. Zielinski of Kensington was called to the scene and had the injured men removed by ambulance to Hospital in Summerside where they received surgical and medical attention from Dr. J. C. Simpson of Summerside, and Squadron Leader N. R. MacGregor, Senior Medical Officer at R. C. A. F. Station Summerside.

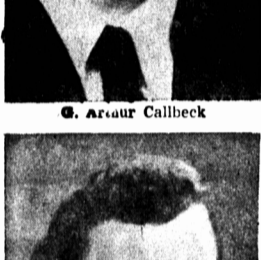
