## Quebec Gov't. Promises Big Hike In Grants For Education

QUEBEC (CP) — The Quebec government Wednesday announced "remarkably generous grants" will be made to all levels of education and hinted greater use will be made of taxation powers granted it under the British North America Act.

The announcement was made in the speech from the throne read by Lieutenant-Governor Gaspard Fautoux in the red-carpeted Legislative Council at the opening of the first session of the 25th Quebec legislature.

Announcement of increased grants to education came in the midst of a growing controversy between the Quebec and federal governments over the federal aid to universities.

Quebec universities accepted the federal grants when they were first offered in 1951. However, the

grants have been refused by Quebec institutions since then because of objections of Premier Duplessis who has described them as an encroachment on exclusive provincial rights in the field of education.

WANT STATUTORY GRANTS

A separate controversy has developed over Quebec government grants to universities. The universities of the province feel Quebec statutory grants are insufficient and that the special or discretionary grants—given to compensate for rejected federal aid—should be placed on a statutory basis.

The 1,600-word throne speech made no reference to the controversy.

EXTEND TAX ACT

In some political quarters a link was seen between the government's statement that increased

expenditures call for greater use of tax sources and the fact that the provincial tax on personal income, imposed in 1954 for three years, expires Jan. 1, 1957.

It was authoritatively learned and reported some time ago that the life of the income tax legislation will be extended for at least another three years.

The speech from the throne announced also that the Quebec government intends to ask the legislature to vote additional funds for farm loans, rural electrification, land drainage and colonization.

It reiterated the Quebec government's opinion that foreign investment capital is necessary for the development of the province's natural resources, that free enterprise is a guarantee of enduring progress, and that industrial decentralization is necessary to the economy of the province.

Legislation dealing with the taxation powers of municipalities was indicated in the speech but no details were given.

QUEBEC GOVERNMENT
