

Hydro-Quebec in Quebec Seen Aid

MONTREAL (CP) — Jean-Claude Lessard, president of Hydro-Quebec, believes expropriation of privately-owned Quebec power companies is "the tip of the magic wand which, for the first time, has allowed Quebec to think of industrialization of some regions."

Privately-owned power companies were expropriated last year, and since then several small co-operative power groups have offered to sell out to the government-owned Hydro-Quebec. The co-ops now are gradually being taken over by Hydro.

"For the first time," Mr. Lessard says, "Quebec can contemplate responsibilities which belong to the modern state and which can be translated into one word, often besmirched but containing the solution to most problems which confront societies: planning."

Hydro-Quebec had been able to make its rates uniform across the province, since expropriation. "If you convert this to the industrial field, it can be seen immediately what a corporation like Hydro-Quebec can mean to Quebec's economy."

By making rates uniform, the hydro-electric commission "has put order into its affairs. . . It can facilitate the establishment of an industry in any given area. This already has been done."

"BUY QUEBEC" POLICY
As far as Hydro's "buy Quebec" policies are concerned, Mr. Lessard says in a statement:

"Without wishing to become involved in narrow nationalism, Hydro-Quebec is duty-bound to practise a form of nationalism."

"If Quebec has given itself a corporation with assets of \$200,000,000, it is because it really intends to get something out of it. That is why, without exception or deviation, Hydro practises the policy of buying at home which has brought astounding results."

In awarding contracts, Hydro doesn't hesitate to favor Quebec enterprises in order to stimulate the economy. Better still, because of this stubbornness, foreign companies have come to establish themselves in Quebec. They do not have not done this because we're good-looking but have only one principle: locate where there is purchasing power.

"The \$200,000,000 Hydro spends each year in the Quebec market surely count for something in the economic reawakening of Quebec but this money, if it weren't handled rationally, would not bring as much value for collective prosperity."

"It is by drawing industries to Quebec that Hydro can render the greatest service to the province."
